

Recreation In Haileybury

Recreation in Haileybury has come a long way since the time of the first pioneers, when recreation was a matter of self entertainment more than a part of an organized social activity.

It is becoming more essential each year that recreation be well planned and well organized, in order to function properly. This is an opportune time to discuss the Haileybury recreation set-up, since this fall members representing recreation societies from communities all over northern Ontario will be assembling in Haileybury to attend the annual meeting of the Northern Ontario Zone of the Ontario Recreation Commission. The aim of this convention is to make the members of the various societies more familiar with the best ways of organizing and financing the recreation in their own municipalities.

This year also the people of the town of Haileybury have been seriously considering the building of a new recreation centre, to provide both more recreation facilities and quarters in which they can unify their activities.

The activities which are supported by the Haileybur Recreation Commission are as follows:

This year the Commission have two park supervisors, who will take charge of the children in Rotary Playground, Joyce Houtling and Sally Whitby. The supervisors will be on duty from 10 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. every day. The playground is planned to provide recreation in the form of crafts, games and a story hour for children between the ages of four and twelve. The highlight of the season will be an over-night camping trip for regular attenders. The supervision will begin on July 2.

This year's beach program is planned to start July 3, the senior lifeguard is Pat Arnold, assistant supervisors are Cathy Neelans and Erna St. Louis. They will be

acting as lifeguards and swimming instructors.

The supervisors will be at the beach from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and there will be no instruction on Sunday. The classes will be periodically tested by Red Cross instructors. Enrolment age is from five years of age and up. Last year, twelve swimmers tried the Red Cross Tests.

In field sports J. Shouldice, assisted by Jack Walker and Ernie St. Louis look after the softball, including Pee Wees, Bantams and Midgets, they compete in the local loop, and the Juveniles in the Wabi Valley League. Last year they won the Northern Ontario Softball Championship. The sweaters were supplied by B.P. Company, and crests were supplied by Hill-Clark and Francis.

This year the Recreation Commission is supporting the Haileybury Town Softball League. Dudley Huff is in charge, with Pappy Hurd as vice-chairman, and Norm Abraham, secretary-treasurer.

In addition the Commission supports the Tennis Club of which Marilyn White is secretary-treasurer. The president's chair is vacant.

Under winter sport, George Weston is in charge of the Saturday morning hockey. Last year there were 150 boys in the Minor and Midget Leagues. They had one game in Larder Lake.

G. Regimbal is in charge of the broomball, which is carried on during the winter months.

Curling Club members volunteer their time and skill during the season to help out in the student curling. Harold Hammerstrom is the president of the High School Curling Club. Last year the Ladies' Curling League gave the student curlers a bonspiel. The club has 24 active curlers.

The Figure Skating Club had a membership of 85 last year, the Haileybury club shares the New Liskeard professional instructor. The Film Council in Haileybury

is also supported by the Recreation Commission. Frazer Reavell is the chairman of the council. Their projector and films are used by every organization in town. The council donates the films and projector to any youth organization.

In the coming year the Commission plans to start a Senior Citizens' Club which will be held once a month. They hope to incorporate many different phases of recreation in the program.

COBALT — It was a big day for the Irish in Cobalt Sunday. St. Patrick's separate school was officially opened by A. R. Herbert, MPP. The beautiful new glass and brick structure, built at a cost of some \$75,000, replaces the old frame building that has lasted so long.

Mr. Herbert said that he was proud to see another fine school opening in Cobalt and congratulated the school board on its faith in the future of the town.

The three-room school will serve some 68 pupils. One feature is a large playroom in the basement, which will compensate for the lack of playing space outside.

The school was blessed by Father T. Kavanagh of Cobalt. R. Surtees of North Bay, who is English language separate school inspector for northeastern Ontario, represented the department of education.
