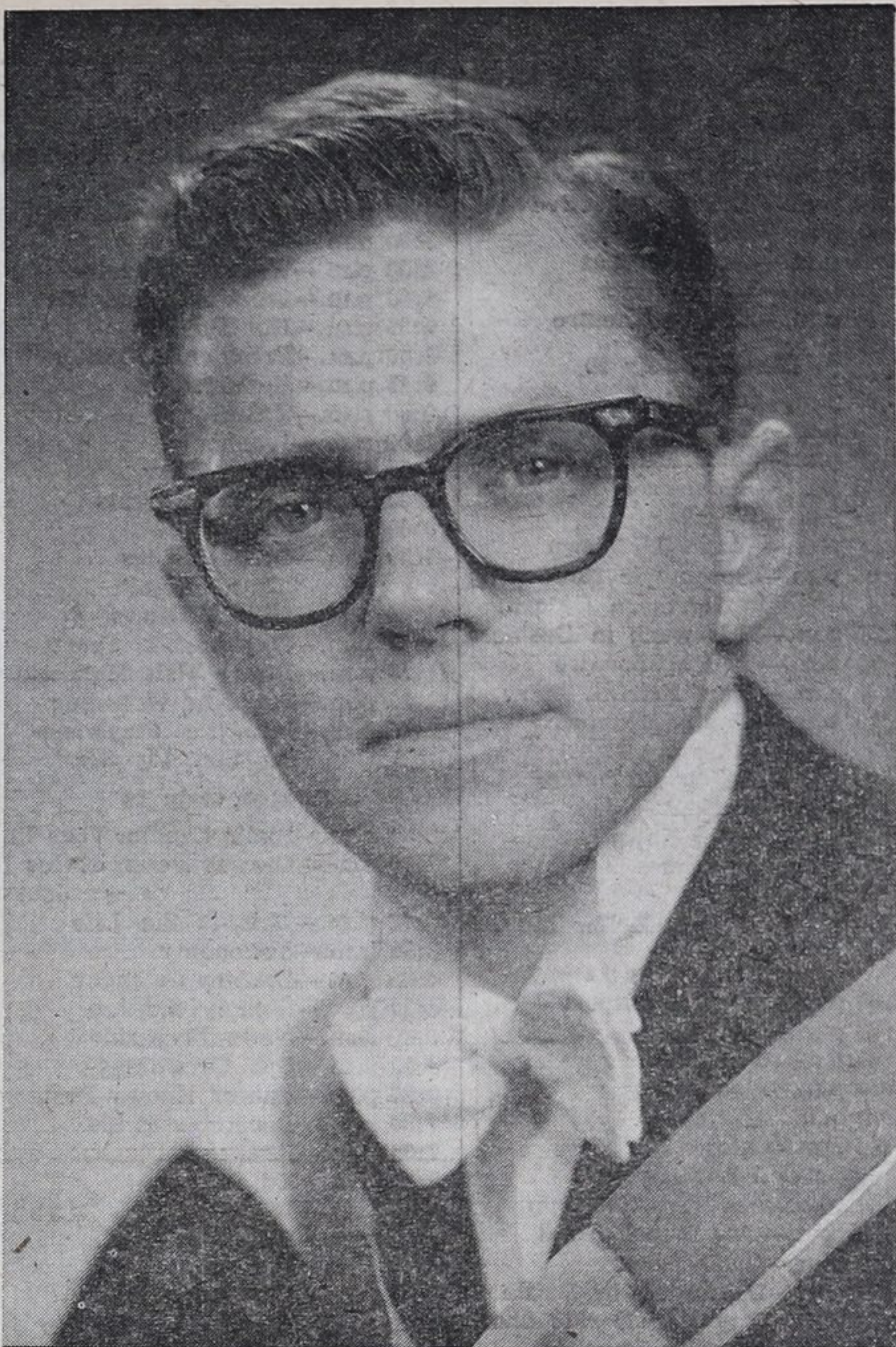
That way we will have an opportunity to advertise for someone to take over the policing, if we decide not to renew the contract."

Councillor Neil Fleming said, "I could offer \$10,000 to a good man to take over the policing of the town and he could have the choice of being on twenty-four hour call or hire additional help. The way things stand we are not only paying three salaries, but an additional \$1,800.00 for a car." He added that he believed, "The Provincial Police want to pull out of Municipal Police work and are taxing tough so the municipalities will cancel their contracts. The province is not looking at this situation from a realistic point of view, they are the people who should be responsible for policing in the towns, most of the laws they enforce are provincial laws, there are very few municipal by-laws to enforce."

Mayor Cooke wondered if a town could afford to pay more for policing than the town foreman or for the Clerk Treasurer. "We have to retain our sense of values and look at this question from a realist angle."

Councillor Fleming added a note of caution, "Originally we brought in the Provincial Police to replace the town police because they were turning in unsatisfactory service, we do not want to make this mistake again."

Council will ask the O.P.P. for time to think.

Mayor Cooke Votes - And Means It

Mayor Art Cooke, centre of a stormy session at Tuesday's council meeting, has taken strong exception to the suggestion that he did not vote legally on the fire truck issue, and has quotes from the municipal act to prove that he is entitled to a vote on the issue and had voted correctly.

"The Act," he said, "states — the head of council—except where he is disqualified to vote by reason of interest or otherwise, may vote with other members on all questions, and except where otherwise expressly provided by this Act, any question on which there is an equality of votes shall be deemed to be negative."

"In other words," said the mayor, "the act gives me a vote, and I intend to use it, particularly when I feel that it is in the best interests of the ratepayers that I should."

"I know that Councillor Whelan is not satisfied that I have a right to vote, or that I exercised it properly. I hope," continued the mayor, "that he carries out his threat to refer this matter to the Department of Municipal Affairs, so that it may be settled in his mind once and for all."

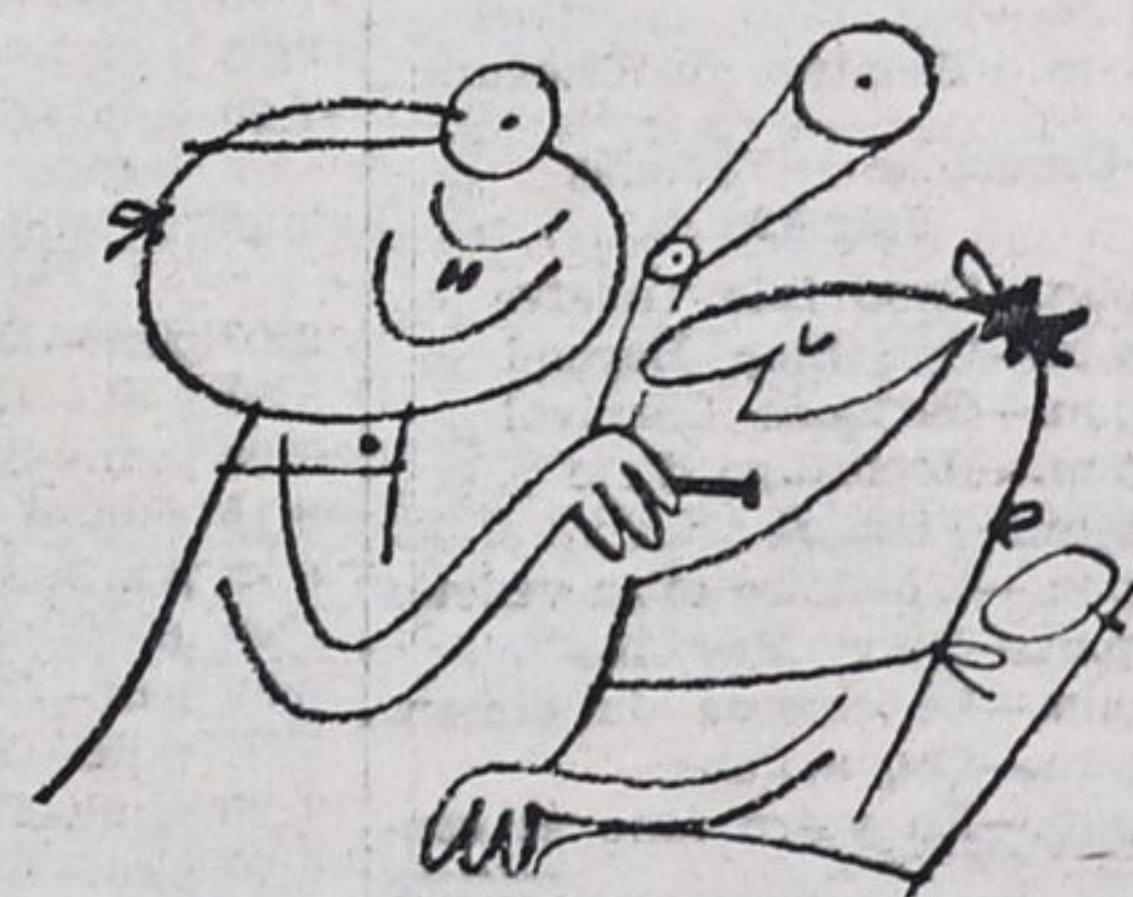

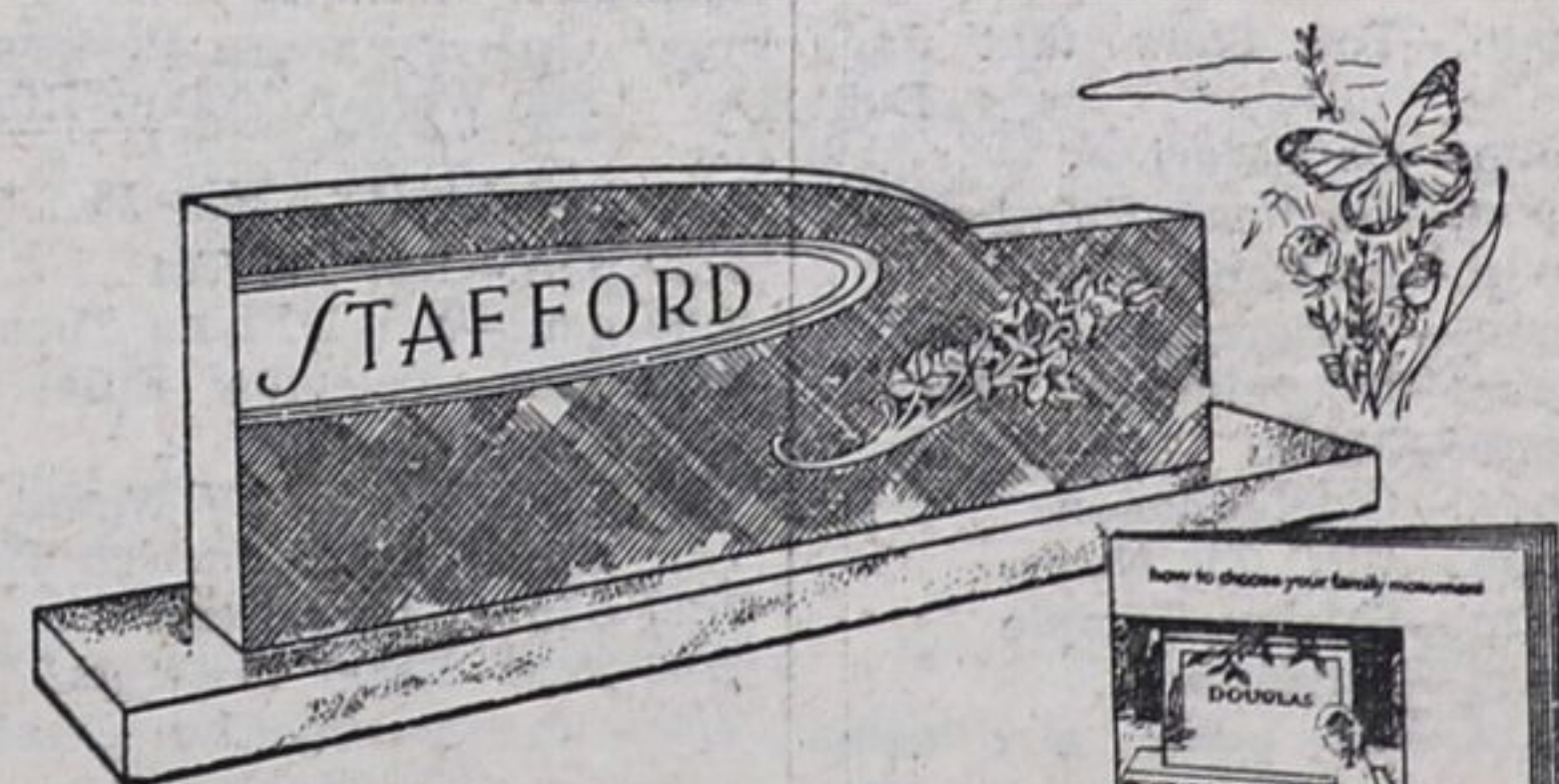
