Mining Access Road To Boston Creek Ore

A mine access road to the iron ore properties of Jalore Mining Corporation is being cut and bulldozed through the bush to a point five miles east of the ONR tracks at Dane.

To date, three miles have been put into navigable order and the main route of the road, allowing passage of some jeep-like vehicles, is cleared through to the mine site at the end of the five-mile road.

Tractor-drawn trailers are hauling out ore samples from the mine site where engineers are slit-trenching in areas where the top spoil has been scraped off.

Jalor, a division of Jones and Laughlin Steel, of Pittsburgh, has awarded the contract for the road building to Caswell Construction, Limited, of Kirkland Lake.

Some difficulties are being encountered in the work. Muskeg and swamp beds are in the path of the road, requiring additional attention.

Sand and gravel, the two main requirements in road construction, are handy to the working area. One large pit of mixed sand and gravel is directly beside the two-mile point of the road and there is another pit at the starting point.
