An experimental project was begun recently which may determine our future fish planting methods. The objectives of the project are:

(a) To compare the angling success resulting from hatchery reared yearling speckled trout planted by air versus those planted by truck; and

(b) To attempt to ascertain the effect of aerial droppiing of yearling speckled trout into deep water areas.

The Esker Lakes Provincial Park is one of the areas being used for this experiment. Plantings were divided equally between air and truck to each of the following lakes: Allan, Ramey, Roach, Lavery, Pall, Mall and Bea. The two lots of fish were fin-clipped at the hatchery a month before planting, with the left pectoral fin clipped for one lot and the right for the other.

To achieve objective (b), onehalf of the lakes were planted in deep waters and one-half in shallow waters previously outlined as target areas. 


