New Liskeard Driver In Serious Condition

Jean Guy Gervais, 18, of New Liskeard, is still in serious condition in hospital at Haileybury after an accident early Monday morning on Highway 11, six miles south of here.

M. Jean Gervais, 17, sister of the driver, and a third occupant of the car, Gabriel Paquette, 19, of Larder Lake, were also hospitalized.

Gervais has internal injuries including pelvic fractures. His sister suffered multiple pelvic fractures. Paquette was treated for contusions and is expected to be released today.

OPP Constable Tom Hill of Haileybury highway detachment said the crash apparently occurred after the car went out of control for a distance of 525 feet, struck a guardrail, losing a bumper, hit a rockcut which sheared off its left

side, rolled once, then came to rest on all four wheels. The car was northbound.

Guide Drowns In Temagami Lake

Dragging operations were continued over the week-end to recover the body of Daniel Twain, Temagami guide, who is believed to have drowned in the early hours of Friday morning.

Twain, with Joe Beaucage and Tommy Petrant, also of Temagami were in the boat when it capsized. The two managed to swim ashore and informed the police from Has- Point when Twain did not make shore.

The accident is being investigated by OPP Constable Ralph Hopkins, who is also in charge of the dragging operations.

Police say this is the first drowning fatality they have had to investigate this season.
