In future all garbage must be in containers, covered by a lid and weighing less than 70 pounds including garbage. No 40 gallon oil drums are to be used.

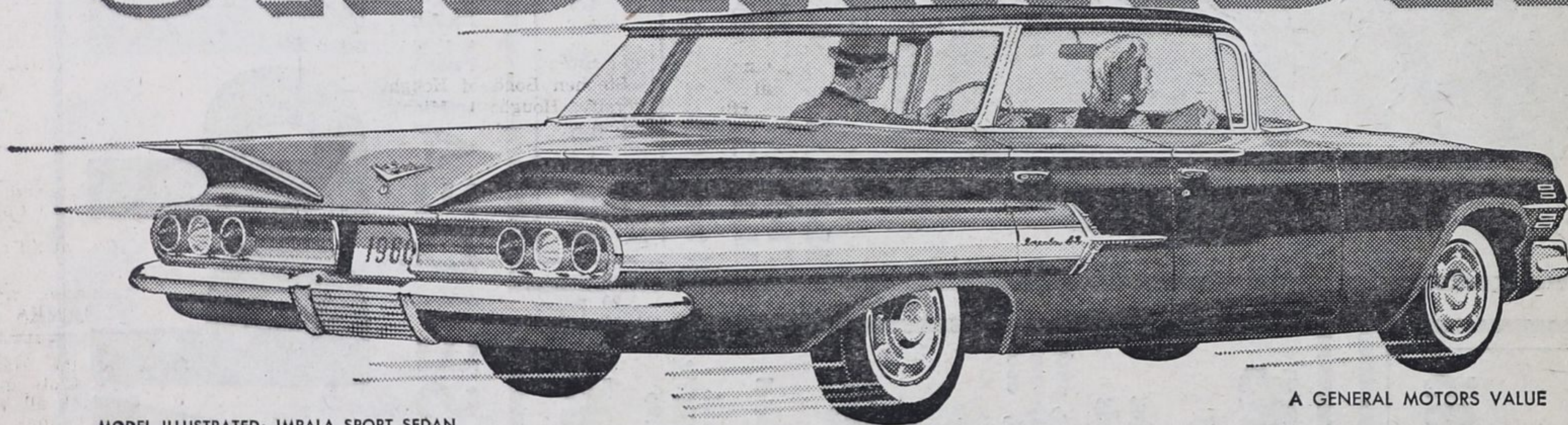
All garbage must be placed on the street or lanes.

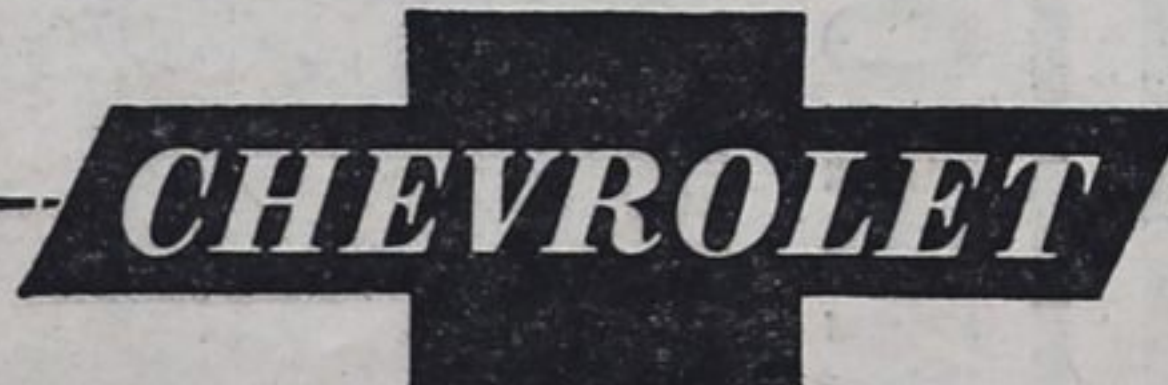
