(Continued From Page One) school population to support one does not exist. Such a school would require enrollment of 1,000 pupils. Provincial records show that a very large percentage of pupils leave school up to Grade 12 thus adding to the cost of maintaining a fully trained staff for the small number reaching Grade 13. In

Northern Ontario there is a further difficulty where the children of those living in the Townships receive free Secondary Education from the province. All municipalities and organized townships lying within a school district would be placed on an equalized assessment for school costs and each would pay its proportional share. Naturally the townships would not be agreeable. This matter was discussed fully in 1949 by representatives from the Department and the urban municipalities.

If an addition of three rooms only to the Public School was made, the cost to the ratepayers would be three mills per annum approximately, based on approved cost of \$20,000 per room and a grant of 50 per cent for a 20 year debenture, or \$50,000 approximate-

ly. The proposed High School should not cost the taxpayers more than \$45,000.

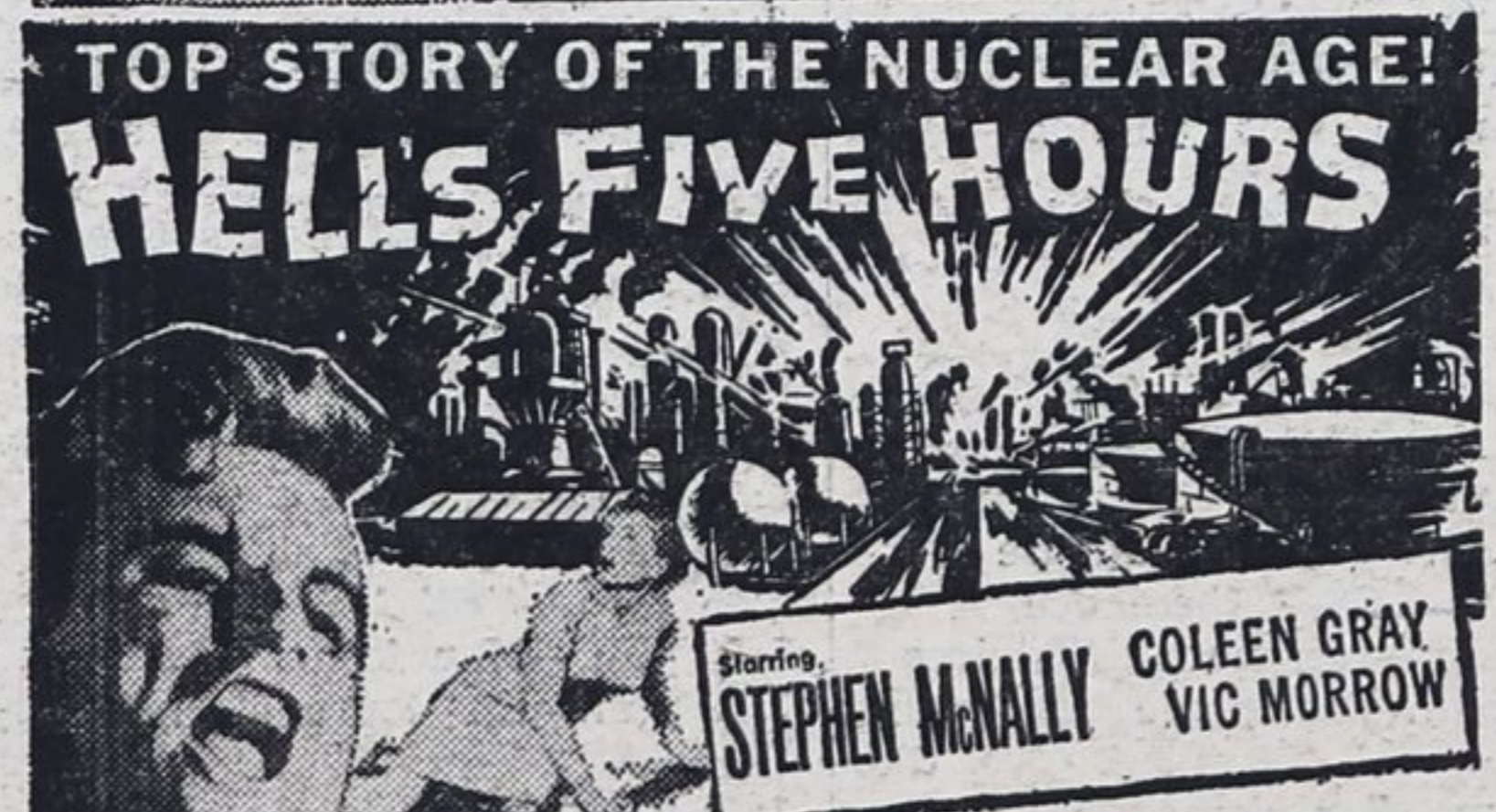

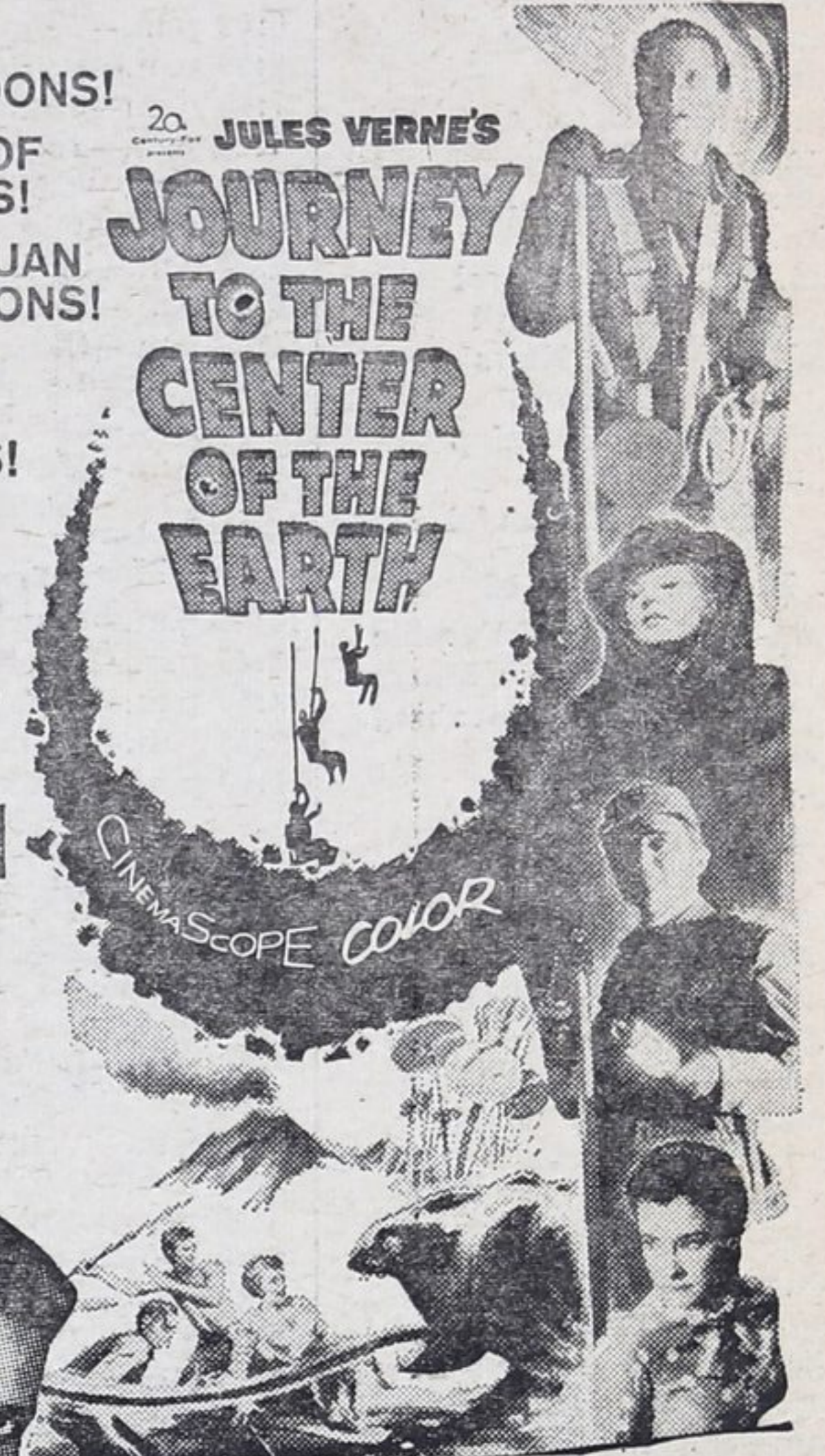
