



Industry in the Tri-Town and surrounding area was proposed by Councillor J. Timmins, speaking on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce, he asked Council for a \$400 grant for Haileybury's portion of the cost.

Mayor Cooke made the alternate proposal that business concerns pay a moderate fee and the Council will match dollar for dollar up to \$500 dollars. This proposal was voted against on the basis that the businessmen would have to have some form of backing first. Mr. Timmins' proposal was finally approved.

A complaint of poor rain water drainage off the roof of the Haileybury Mining School was the last piece of business taken up at the Council meeting. The present situation is dangerous, Council was informed, because the water is eroding the land around the new addition. It was proposed to drain the water into a satisfactory ditch on Hatchford St. This proposal was accepted, and the Department of Public Works will be requested to do the job.
