Notwithstanding the three substantial increases which were given from 1948 to 1957, the disabled war veteran is getting less than half of what all parties agreed to in 1919 as the fair and reasonable basis.

It was emphasized that any Legion member could read the article in its entirety in his own magazine, the April issue of the "Legionary" and Branch representatives were instructed to recommend this to their members.

Mr. Peters explained that the failure of the Federal Budget to provide for increases in disability pensions or veterans benefits constituted a formidable obstacle to those in sympathy with the Legion's submission. However, as a member of the Veterans Affairs Committee, Mr. Peters stated he would continue his efforts on behalf of and in the best interest of war veterans.

The meeting closed on a note of determination by the Legion representatives to continue to vigorously press for more favourable reception to, and action concerning the Legion brief, particularly the long over-due items of immediate concern.
