Silver Bullion Shipped from Temiskaming Lab

There were 344,250 ounces of silver bullion shipped by area mines via the Temiskaming Testing Laboratories at Cobalt in the first quarter of the year.

Figures released by the department of mines show the gross shipping weight of concentrates at 675,782 with a silver content of 912,785 ounces. The concentrates also contained 38,134 pounds of cobalt, 5,092 pounds of nickel, and 8,667 pounds of copper.

Siscoe Metals shipped the most silver bullion, with 91,199 ounces. Siscoe was closely followed by Agnico Mines with 86,963 ounces, and Deer Horn with 64,136 ounces. Langis Silver near New Liskeard shipped 36,811 ounces of bullion.

Langis led the field in concentrates shipped and silver recovery, with 317,318 pounds of concentrates estimated to yield 316,094 ounces of silver. Siscoe shipped 145,913 pounds of concentrates, containing 246,766 ounces of silver.
