## Englehart Tries For Provincial Police College

Like many Northern town councils, the Englehart town fathers are trying to get the provincial police college to be established at Englehart.

In a letter read at the recent council meeting, J. F. Robert, director of the committee responsible for selecting a suitable site, stated that he will be in Englehart August 22, and will meet with the council then. The letter stated that at least 35 acres will be required.

The first woman ever to be appointed to the Englehart High School Board will be Miss Eullah Pollock. She was appointed by the council to fill the seat vacated by W. M. Field, who resigned as he was going to Victoria.

"The town can't be run without money," Councillor Harry Archer remarked when tax arrears were discussed. The tax collector was told to get busy and collect.

Mayor M. R. Killins said that a pension plan for the town's ten employees will start this fall.

No more funds are available from the Department of Highways for additional road improvements, according to a letter from the Department. The letter said that requests had been exceptionally heavy this year, and current appropriations are exhausted.

An application was granted for an enlargement to Holy Trinity Separate School. Opened this year with two rooms, and some 60 pupils, enrolment this fall is expected to be close to 100, largely due to the recent closing of St. Stephen's Separate School at Charlton. The French speaking pupils will be taken to Earlton, and the English speaking to Englehart.

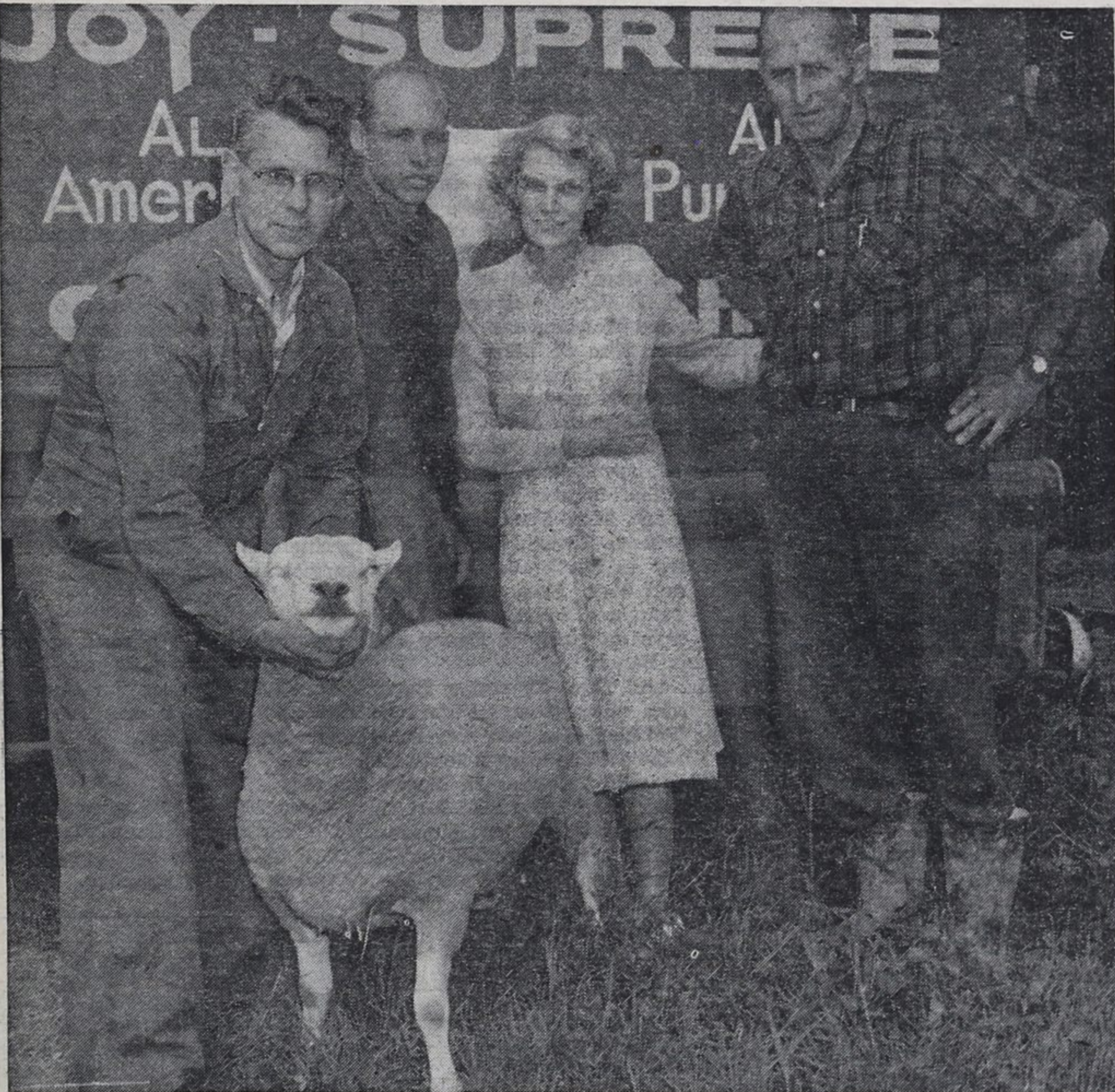

## Health Unit Reports On Various Activities

In a report issued by the Temiskaming Health Unit for the months of May and June, it was announced that during that period, immunization clinics had been completed in Virginiatown, King Kirkland, Swastika, Earlton, Kerns Township, New Liskeard, Gowganda and Shining Tree.

Tuberculin testing by the Heaf Method was carried out at all Secondary Schools in Haileybury and New Liskeard and on all elementary school children in Virginiatown. The number of tests done totalled 1,177. There were also 346 X-Rays taken at the Health Unit.

In co-operation with the public and separate school authorities, pre-school registration was held in all urban centres of the Health Unit. This gave an appreciated opportunity to see and interview the parents of the children starting school in September.

Miss Winnifred Lacey of New Liskeard spent the month of May with the Unit doing Public Health field work, and has recently completed her Public Health nursing

course at the University of Ottawa. Dr. D. Davidson of Dundas also visited the Unit for one week's field work as part of his Public Health course.

Miss Muriel Rice, Public Health Nurse, attended the Canadian Nurses' Association convention in Halifax, as a delegate from District No. 12 of the Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario.

The heavy rains during the spring months were probably a contributory factor in causing contamination of wells and bathing beaches and more water samples than usual have been taken so far. Also more complaints regarding private sewage disposal systems than in past years.

An outbreak of food poisoning following a turkey dinner when about two-thirds of the persons attending became ill, was investigated. The organism responsible for the illness was not isolated but was strongly suspected to be of the Salmonella group. The illness from this is acute and uncomfortable but not of a serious nature, but the outbreak stresses
