Englehart Tries For Provincial Police College

Like many Northern town councils, the Englehart town fathers are trying to get the provincial police college to be established at Englehart.

In a letter read at the recent council meeting, J. F. Robert, director of the committee responsible for selecting a suitable site, stated that he will be in Englehart August 22, and will meet with the council then. The letter stated that at least 35 acres will be required.

The first woman ever to be appointed to the Englehant High School Board will be Miss Eullah Pollock. She was appointed by the council to fill the seat vacated by W. M. Field, who resigned as he was going to Victoria.

"The town can't be run without money," Councillor Harry Archer remarked when tax arrears were discussed. The tax collector was told to get busy and collect.

Mayor M. R. Killins said that a pension plan for the town's ten employees will start this fall.

No more funds are available from the Department of Highways for additional road improvements, according to a letter from the Department. The letter said that requests had been exceptionally heavy this year, and current appropiations are exhausted.

An application was granted for an enlargement to Holy Trinity Separate School. Opened this year with two rooms, and some 60 pupils, enrolment this fall is expected to be close to 100, largely due to the recent closing of St. Stephen's Separate School at Charlton. The French speaking pupils will be taken to Earlton, and the English speaking to Englehart.

Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Nixon of Lang Street in Cobalt, are sitting tight and hoping. The couple have occupied their home for some 40 years, but are faced with eviction by Mastermet Mines, which owns the ground on which their house is located.

They and Mr. T. Othmer of Earl Street received lawyer's letters last month, telling them they must vacate by last Monday, August 8.

Mr. Nixon is seriously ill and confined to his bed.

The threat of eviction was the latest move in the long struggle between Mastermet and some 57 families that occupy homes on the company's ground.

Last year three persons were evicted when the company sold some ground to an oil company.
