Look at the Record

EDUCATION

94 new classrooms constructed in Temiskaming in the past five years at a total cost of \$2,115,000. In Ontario as a whole, government aid to education in 1959 totalled \$214,766,000. Compare this with the \$13,000,000 aid to education in the last year of the previous administration.

HYDRO

Frost has put hydro on the farm. Now 95 per cent of rural areas have hydro. In 1944 Ontario Hydro had 2,469,800 horsepower. Today it has 7,722,650 horsepower with new hydro plants being constructed to provide for future development. In 1943 Hydro installed 21 miles of rural line. From 1944 to 1958, a total of 26,051 miles of rural line were installed, supplying 336,439 new rural customers.

AGRICULTURE

During 1959, 165 farms in Temiskaming received \$53,469 in grants towards clearing 2,174 acres. Artificial insemination is improving northern herds. Last year's grants were paid on 1,624 cattle receiving A.I. Veterinary services to farmers in outlying areas are subsidized. In Northern Ontario last year \$21,600 were paid out to help farmers in remote areas.

HIGHWAYS

Development roads in Temiskaming since 1947 have cost \$796,348. Subsidies to municipalities in 1959 totalled \$238,842. Compare this with the \$34,989 paid to municipalities under the previous government.

DEVELOPMENT

Premier Frost dedicated himself to the development and expansion of Ontario. During the past nine years Ontario's population has increased by 1,491,458 people by July. Compare this with Saskatchewan, where the nine year increase was only 78,275.

HEALTH

The government spends more than \$92,000,000 each year on Ontario health services. The Temiskaming Health Unit is subsidized to the extent of \$55,000 annually. Recent grants to aid hospital construction included \$80,000 to Englehart hospital, and \$63,000 to Haileybury hospital.
