

# Stocker Sale At New Liskeard

New Liskeard Auction Sale of Stocker and Feeder cattle will be held October 12 with V. G. Shepherdson as auctioneer. This sale is the last one of five such sales in Northern Ontario. The first was at South River on September 23, with 1,800 cattle on sale. The second at Thessalon will have 1,200 head and the third is sponsored by a new group, The Cattlemen's Association at Rainy River, on October 1, when 1,000 cattle will be offered for sale.

Manitoulin Island still heads the list in quantity, with 2,700 cattle ready to go to the auction block on September 29.

The New Liskeard Sale is the last and smallest, with just 650 head of cattle to be sold, but the auctioneer will have excellent quality to offer, coming from the rich farmlands in the agricultural area surrounding New Liskeard. All five sales are located on Provincial highways with railway service available also.

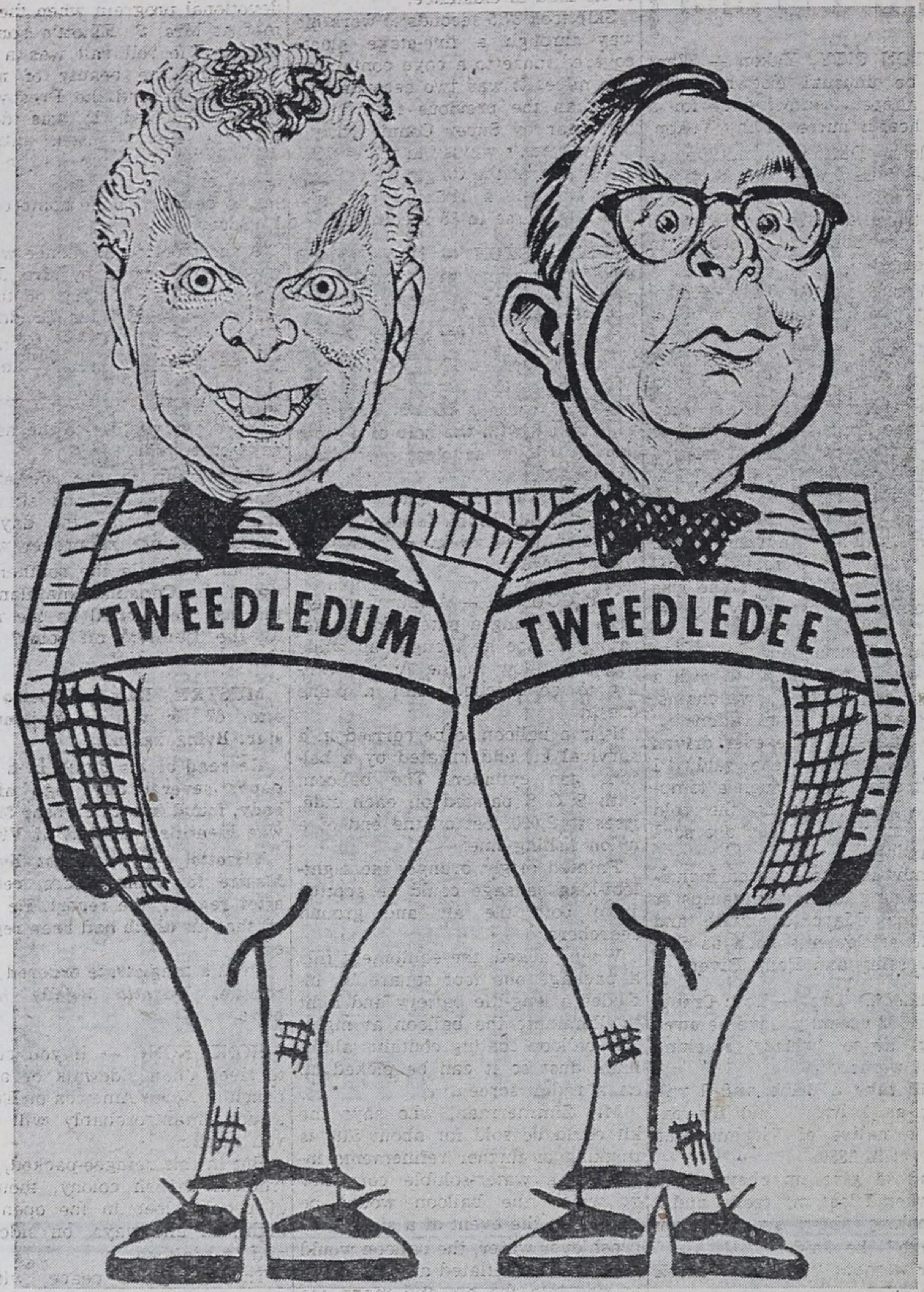
## Cobalt
