test or chest X-ray.
In most areas meetings have been held to finalize instructions to canvassers and clinic staff. For any canvassers who have not yet visited the homes may we remind you to stress the importance of TWO visits to the clinics giving Tuberculin tests — one to have the skin test and the second for the reading and having an X-ray where indicated.
All persons over 40 years of age are urged to have an X-ray. Reminder cards will be given out at the "giving clinic" so that persons attending will know what date to return to that clinic for reading or X-ray.
The Community and Industrial Mass Chest X-ray surveys will be held on the following dates: Haileybury, September 28 and 29; New Liskeard, September 30, October 3, 4 and 5.
The Community Mass Tuberculin Tests will be taken in New Liskeard, September 28, 29, 30 and October 3.

"Some formula will be worked out with the operators whereby the present crisis will be eliminated," he concluded.
The addition of a treatment plant could process silver, leaving cobalt to be stockpiled for future demand.

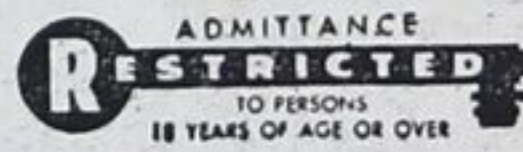
