Reports on Record Survey In Temiskaming

Temiskaming District Tuberculosis Association met this week at Kirkland Lake and during the evening members heard sectional reports on the recent T.B. Clinics held across the district.

Although the final figures are not yet available, indications are that there will be close to 100 per cent increase in tests taken over the last survey in 1956.

With just a part of the district heard from, the 1960 figures show that 17,235 persons took the tests as compared with 9,930 in 1956.

Added to the number of those who took their tests in 1960 are the district high school students who were tuberculin tested in the spring, and miners who have regular X-Rays taken at regular periods.

In the Tri-Town area the results were considerably better than the average for the district.

In Cobalt, 1,454 took the tests, North Cobalt, 441, Haileybury, 1,042, and New Liskeard, 3,150.

Executive members attributed the success of the clinics to the excellent organizations and the willingness to help exhibited by individuals and organizations across the district.

At the meeting it was announced that Dr. E. R. Harris would attend a meeting of the Medical Advisors section of the Ontario Tuberculosis Association being held in Toronto today. Chief subject to be discussed there is "Expansion of Control Programs".

Those in attendance also had a chance to see the 1960 Christmas Seal supplies, on hand for the starting of the annual campaign on November 14.

The next meeting of the Association will be in New Liskeard on November 22.
