Mr. McGarry wanted to know why he couldn't get a copy of the list of back taxes. He said that he also couldn't understand why the council was expected to study the budget at a meeting, but couldn't get a copy of it to study at home in their own time.

Town Clerk Vezina said that one copy was kept in the office, the rest sent to Toronto.

Mr. Miller said that he was making a formal request for a copy of the back tax list up to October 30.

Mr. Vezina said that he would study the municipal act and see if he had any legal right to issue the copy.

Mr. McGarry said that he had taken legal advice, and he was entitled to have a list.

The council forced through a motion to adjourn just as Mr. Miller was trying to get another motion tabled.
