

Cubs Win Four Straight Drop Lions By 6-4 Count

New Liskeard Cubs won their fourth straight game in the KL and D Hockey League race last Friday evening, with Kirkland Lake Lions on the short end of a 6-4 score.

The Cubs were held even in the first and last period by a greatly improved Lions team, but out-scored their rivals three to one in the middle stanza to keep their string of wins intact.

The game was a rough one, sixteen penalties were handed out by the officials, including one misconduct to Perry for too strongly protesting a roughing penalty to rear guard Thompson. Each team had eight men in the sin bin during the game.

The first period was a see-saw affair, Germain beat Shortt in the first few minutes of the game, and Larouche got it back in about the same time.

Play was even, and neither team was able to score when the other was shorthanded. Belanger turned a pass from Vail into a counter which was matched by Perry a minute later.

It was all New Liskeard in the middle 20 minutes. Vail, Belanger and Haines scored in that order and Gore broke through the Cub defence in the last minute of the period to keep the Lions in the game. The Cubs scored two of their goals when the Lions were shorthanded and one when Downie was serving an elbowing penalty.

 6. For diplomatic, economic, commercial and cultural reasons.

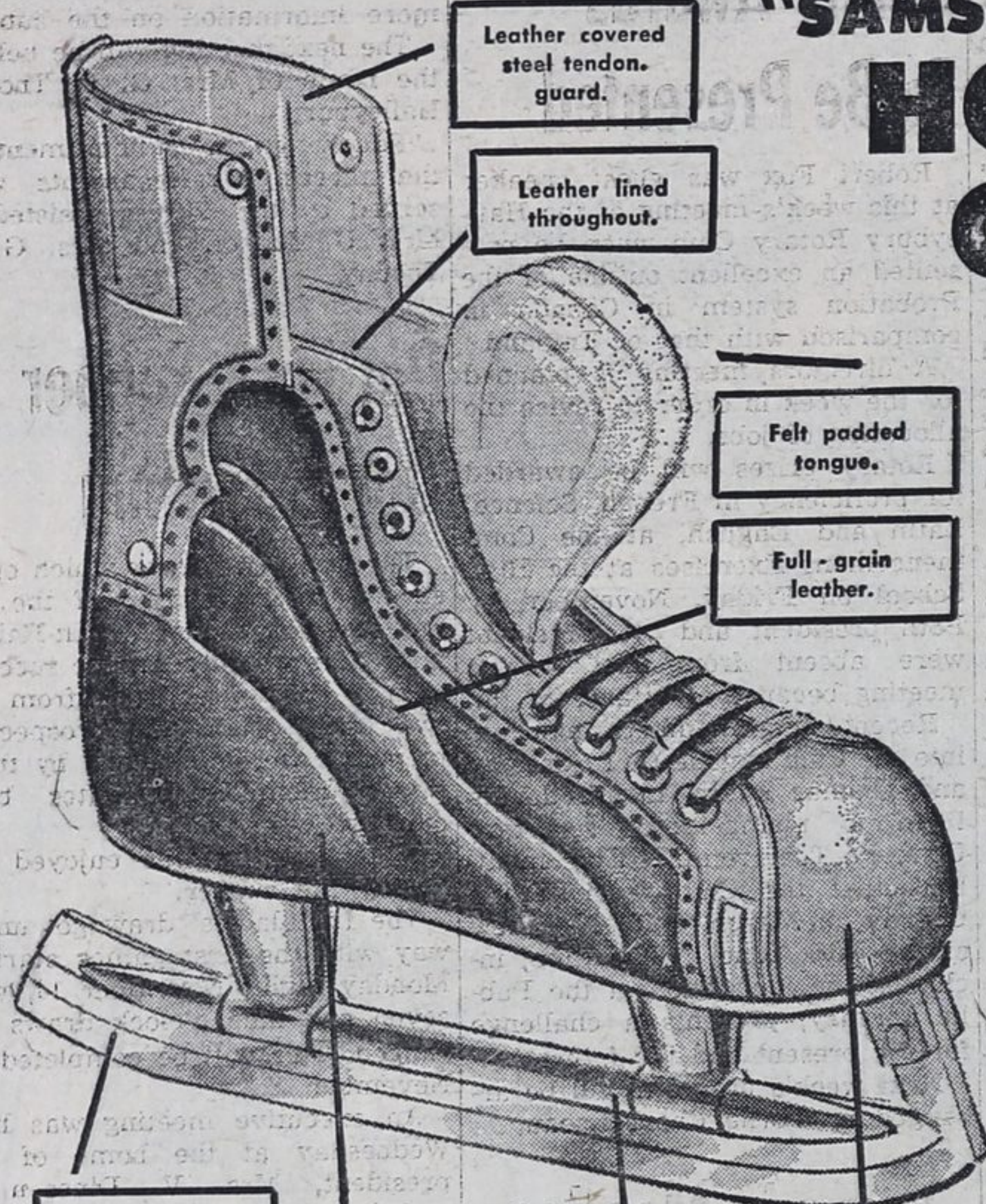
Why in Elementary Schools?
