N. B. Keevil, president of Temagami Mines, anticipases that new ore reserves will be discovered during the current exploration program at the mine.

Temagami Mining Co. showed a net profit after all charges of \$67,303 for its first full year of production which ended June 30. Operating profit was \$463,303. Total production income was \$2,095,683.

Ore reserves at Temagami's high-grade operation amounted to 113,668 tons grading 8.4% copper at June 30. Working capital was \$278,071 compared with a deficit year earlier of \$351,482.
