## Temagami Mine Expects New Ore

N. B. Keevil, president of Temagami Mines, anticipates that new ore reserves will be discovered during the current exploration program at the mine.

Temagami Mining Co. showed a net profit after all charges of \$67,303 for its first full year of production which ended June 30. Operating profit was \$463,303. Total production income was \$2,095,683.

Ore reserves at Temagami's high-grade operation amounted to 113,668 tons grading 8.4% copper at June 30. Working capital was \$278,071 compared with a deficit year earlier of \$351,482.

## Record Enrolment For 4H Clubs

Canada's project enrolment in 4-H reached a new high in 1960 of 78,206, an increase of 2,352 over 1959. During the same period the number of organized 4-H clubs increased from 5,271 to 6,251.

The actual number of boys and girls taking part in 4-H in 1960 was 65,407, a decline of 1,279 from 1959.

The average age of the members enrolled in 1960 was 13.5 and the average number of members per club was 12.5.
