A large portion of the Lion's success was in the manner in which they tied up the Vail, Larouch, Haines line. The high scoring pivot never had a chance to get going all night. Every time he attempted to start his swinging, winging rush, two men covered him, and Larouche got the same treatment.

As well as stopping the scoring line from working in, the Lions gave the boys as fancy a belting as has been seen on Liskeard ice this year.

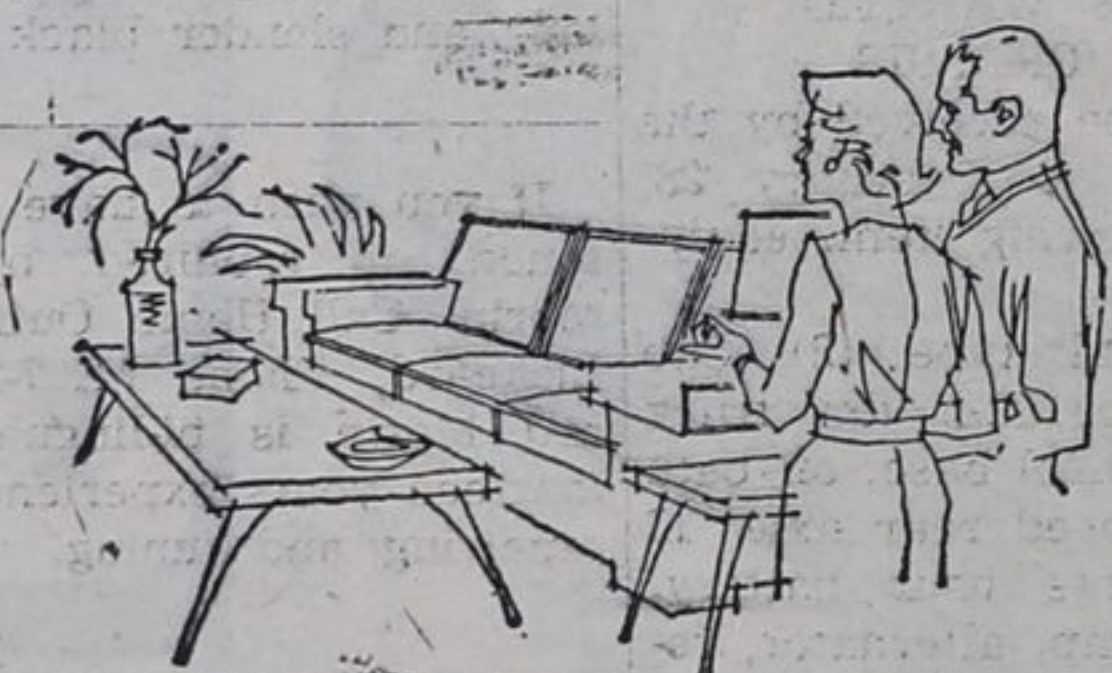
