Lake, halfway between Sixty-Six and Silver Center.

Soon after, Silver Center boomed when the Keeley mine proved to be a winner, and at one time where today there is nothing but one empty shack, there was a movie theatre, two schools, several stores, and the Farmer's Bank.

The Keeley, Frontier, Trout Lake and Wettlaufer mines were all major producers. The Trout Lake mine holds the record for the richest carload of high grade silver ore ever shipped, it was worth \$250,000.00.

The Keeley mine has a monument to itself in the Parliament buildings at Toronto. At the entrance there is a chunk of silver ore containing 60,000 ounces.

The T. & N.O. operated a branch line to Silver Center until 1931, The right of way is now being used by the hydro trucks as a service road. All mill and mine buildings as well as every sign of the once prosperous little town has now vanished. But many mining companies are now investigating the area again.




