About 20 years ago, he moved to Kirkland Lake, where he organized and operated the Sutherland Printing Company.

He is survived by his wife, formerly Miss Mildred Mayhew of Haileybury, and two daughters, Shirley and Norma; five brothers, James of Schumacher, Kenneth and Earl of Nanaimo, B.C.; William of North Bay, and Douglas of Englehart; and two sisters, Mrs. Emerson Carmichael of Sudbury and Mrs. Percy Grozelle of Haileybury.

Interment was in the Kirkland Lake Cemetery.
