

District "K" Meeting Planned for Englehart

ENGLEHART — The Englehart Branch of the Canadian Legion will host the semi-annual meeting of District 'K', April 22 and 23.

District 'K' is comprised of Legion branches from Temagami to Hornepayne. It is anticipated that delegates from all branches will attend the convention.

The event embraces a parade of delegates, with their colors, to the Cenotaph to lay a wreath in memory of departed Comrades. The parade will be held following the business sessions which should conclude between 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m., Sunday the 23rd.

Englehart delegates who have attended similar meetings in other centres have invariably been dismayed by the apparent absence of life in these communities at parade time. This may have been due to the parades formerly being held during the noon hour and possibly unknown by the general public.

It is felt that Englehart residents are averse to imparting an impression of inertia to visitors. To dispel any such indication, residents are invited to view the parade thereby demonstrating that while Englehart may not be massive, neither is it melancholic nor insignificant.

The parade will form up at the Legion Hall and proceed via Fourth Ave., directly to the Cenotaph. Returning, the parade will advance on Second St. to Seventh Ave.; Seventh Ave. to Fourth St.; Fourth St. to Fourth Ave. and Fourth Ave. to the Legion Hall.

It has been suggested that those who procured flags and accessories at the time of the Semi-Centennial may wish to display them on this occasion. Such a gesture would be regarded with much gratification by the Legion.

Winter Snow, Summer Hail

The difference between snow and hail is that hail is usually produced by a very sudden cooling of air containing a great deal of water vapour. We commonly get hail in summer and snow in winter.

Geological Teams In Temiskaming

Fifteen geological survey parties of the Ontario Department of Mines will be working throughout the province during the coming field season.

J. A. Grant will have a party in Catherine and Marter Townships located northeast of New Liskeard in the District of Temiskaming.

J. E. Thomson, chief geologist, will visit a number of locations in Ontario, and the Resident Geologists at Port Arthur, Kirkland Lake and Cobalt will make their usual examinations of mineral deposits.

About 50 graduate and undergraduate students in the geological sciences, mostly from Ontario universities, will be employed as assistants on the survey parties. The field season generally extends from mid-May to mid-September. Staff geologists of the Department and other fully qualified specialists are leaders of the parties.

Expert Says Septic Tanks Need Proper Care

"Some of the ideas about septic tanks cost farm families considerable money each year," says Prof. Ross Irwin of the Department of Engineering Science, O.A.C.

For instance, he knocks down the theory that the liquid coming from a septic tank is pure. He says the effluent from a septic tank "will be considerably more contaminated" than the material going in. For that reason, never discharge the runoff from a septic tank into a stream, ditch, or underground water table.

"The best place for a septic tank discharge is into the top layers of soil where the bacteria will break it down and render it harmless. That's why tile lines of the septic bed should be laid fairly shallow — about two feet deep. It is much better than using seepage pits for absorption." The engineer also cautions

against running wash water around the septic tank. The soap tends to clog the seepage lines. Also he suggests you run wash water (especially water with detergent in it) into a special drainage area — not the septic tank.

Check your septic tank at least once a year. Don't wait until it quits working to check it — it might be winter when it quits working. The level of sludge deposits in the bottom of the tank should be measured. As soon as the tank is 1/3 full of sludge have it cleaned. A broom stick can be used to make the test.

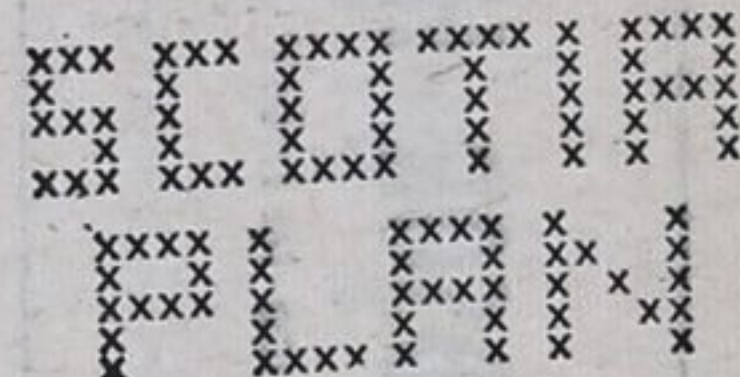
One last point: it's better to clean your tank in the spring than fall. Spring cleaning gives the tank time to get into full operation before winter.

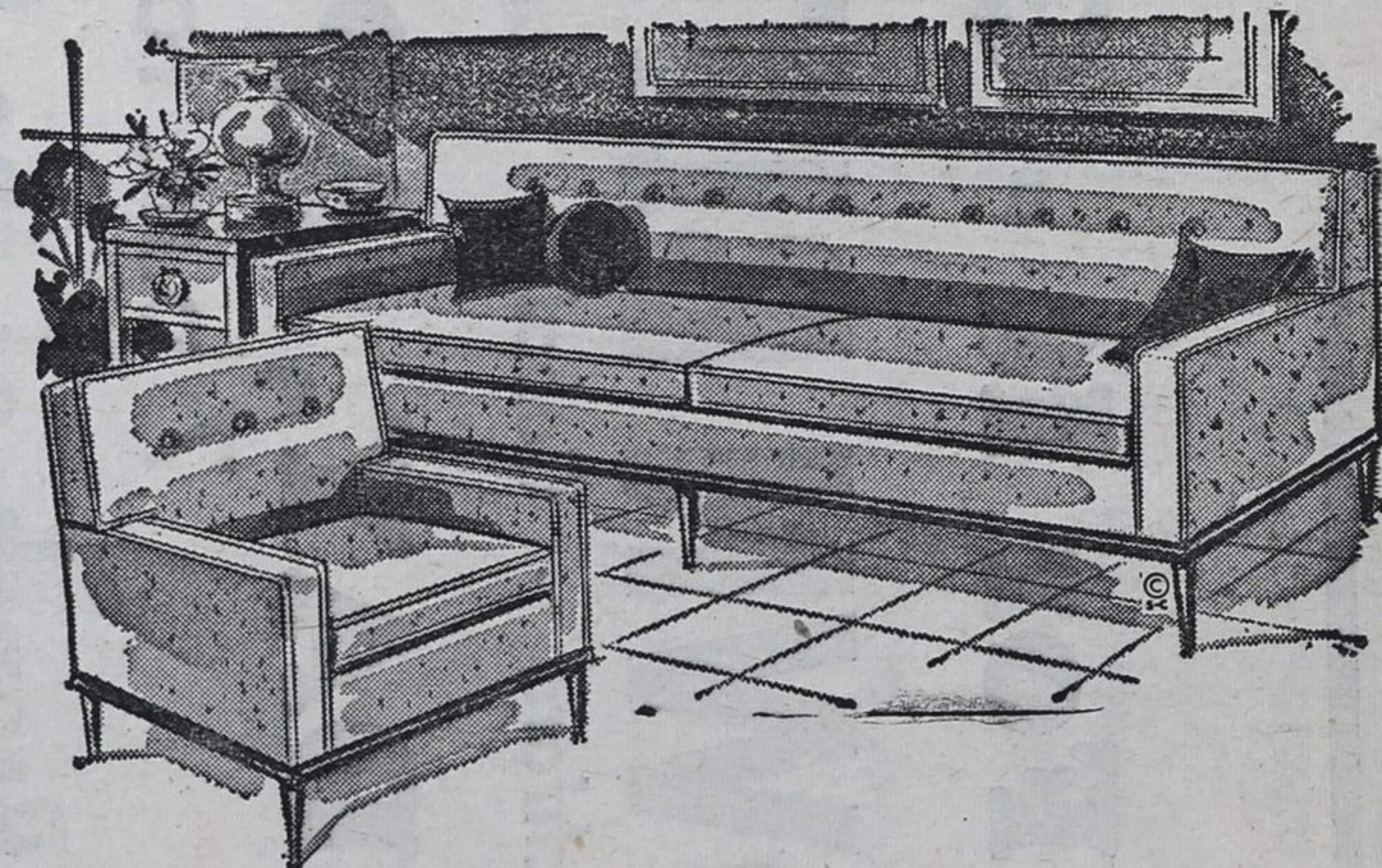
