proved a resolution asking that government institute provincial lotteries, but that sale of tickets should be limited to chartered banks and post offices.

The resolution pointed out that the province is losing a great deal of money each year to lotteries conducted abroad, and that the provincial government is already taking a percentage on gambling activities on pari-mutuels at race tracks.

It was resolved to ask the department of veterans' affairs to consider the possibility of building a veterans' hospital in Northern Ontario, with facilities for chronic patients. The Legion's Ontario Provincial Command representative was asked in another resolution to form a separate committee to study and assist veterans' housing. The resolution pointed out that the housing committee was amalgamated with the pensions committee due to the lack of activity in veterans' housing, but the present interest in this makes a separate committee necessary.

The increasing tendency, on the part of the provincial government to ignore veterans' status in appointments was criticized and a resolution addressed to the provincial command asking it to press for the establishment of a veteran preferential system similar to that existing in the federal civil service. It was also resolved that the word Canadian should be super-imposed on the new proposed badge for the Legion.
