The previous phase of the work at United Cobalt consisted of reactivating the old 850-foot shaft sunk in 1908, and drilling for faourable structure. A highgrade intersection was followed-up with a crosscut for more detailed drilling, the results of which have produced the decision to proceed with development work for access.


