

Orangemen March At Liskeard Beach

Members of Northern Lodges of the Orange Order held their annual July parade in New Liskeard last Saturday.

The parade was led by a New Liskeard police car and headed by Carl Cameron of Harris L.O.L. as King William, riding the traditional white horse. Members of the New Liskeard Legion Pipe Band added color and music.

Taking part in the parade were the North Cobalt Juvenile Lodge, the North Cobalt L.O.B.A., and the North Cobalt L.O.L.; Timmins L.O.B.A.; Timmins L.O.L.; Swastika L.O.L.; Kirkland Lake L.O.L.; Kirkland Lake L.O.B.A.; Englehart L.O.L.; and Harris L.O.L. Members from North Bay L.O.L. and L.O.B.A. were also present to join in the march.

At the Beach the afternoon program was opened by County Master Harold Hie of Harris L.O.L., welcoming all members and guests. Councillor Pat Birnie then extend-

ed a welcome on behalf of the town. Past County Master of Temiskaming North, Robert Connelly, E. Davis, Past County Master of Nipissing and A. Labucane of Cochrane all spoke briefly.

The special speaker, Rev. T. A. Duke of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, who spoke on the work and ideals of the Orange Order, said that to be at peace with one's self, one must be at peace with the world and live according to the rules of Christ.

Mr. Hie announced the winners of the various prizes: in the Ladies Lodges, North Cobalt L.O.B.A. received the prize for the best appearance; Swastika was the prize winner for the Men's Lodges; North Cobalt Juvenile Lodge received the prize for their class; prizes for the oldest lady marching and the oldest man, went to Mrs. C. E. Miller of the North Cobalt Lodge, who was 83; and to Richard Silverthorn of Harris, 91 years of age.

Douglas Hie, eight-year-old son of County Master Harold Hie, carried the memorial wreath in the parade, which was laid at the Cenotaph by Mr. Hie. Judy Shaver, seven-year-old of the North Cobalt Juvenile Lodge, marched with the best of them, her bouffant skirt swaying jauntily as she carried her flag.

Three members of the Royal Black Preceptory were in attendance, W. J. Haughton of Englehart; W. J. Edwards of North Bay and Harold Hie of the Harris Lodge; also Harry Regan, 84, of Timmins, a member of the Black Lodge. Dr. C. E. Miller, a veteran Orangeman did not miss the celebration, despite his 88 years.

Harris L.O.L. which includes New Liskeard and area, still have three of their charter members, who joined when the Lodge was organized in 1910. They are Thomas and William Waugh and Robert Armstrong. Wilfrid Tucker, a pioneer of the district, will mark fifty years as a member of the Harris Lodge next year.

The Supreme Court of Canada has ruled it illegal to operate automatic coin laundries on Sunday.

The nine member court upheld the judgement of the Ontario Court of Appeal ruling that operation of automatic coin laundries on Sundays constitutes a breach of the Lord's Day Act.

The courts judgement followed a test case appeal to determine whether the growing number of automatic laundries may remain open on Sundays even if no one is on hand to supervise.
