back into the game. In the 9th inning Maisoneauve and Johnston scored to give Latchford the game.

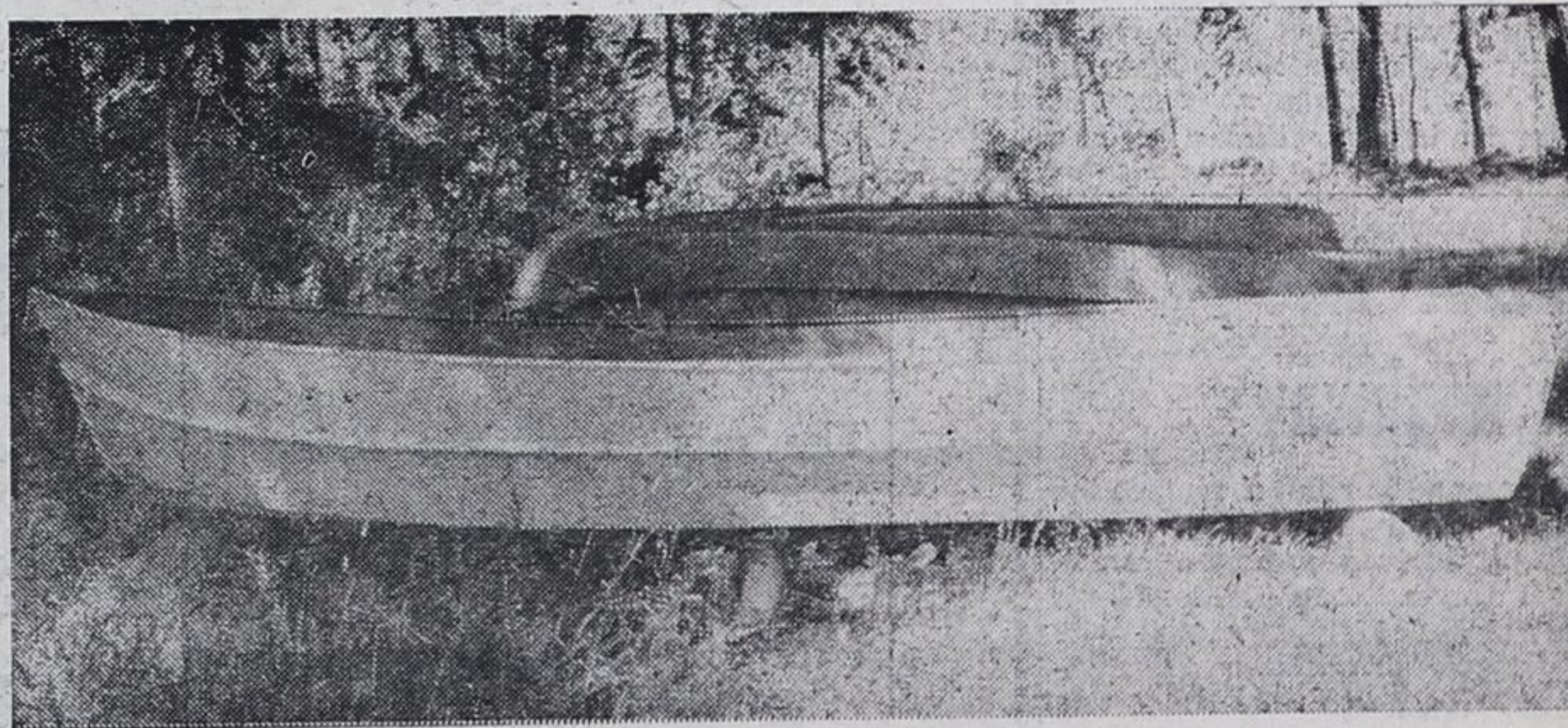
