PIKE, N.H.—A resolution urging Canadian manufacturers to promote children's wear with a distinctive Canadian coloring was passed at the annual conference of the Children's Apparel Manufacturers Association here. Maple leaf green, Mountie red, Laurentian berry, Rocky Mountain grey and Banff blue were colors suggested.

ST. ALBANS, England—A Hertfordshire college is offering a one-year domestic course for teen-age girls, covering everything from sewing to detergents. Successful students get a diploma they can show their future husbands.

SCUNTHORPE, England — Dog lover Jeremiah Green has made a will setting up a £300,000 (\$40,000) trust fund to build and maintain a luxury home for stray dogs.

"Some people will call me a crank for leaving all my money to dogs," said real estate dealer Green, "but they have been my greatest friends."

The dogs' home will be a memorial to Rusty, a cocker spaniel Green had for 14 years.

LONDON — About 3,000 roach died in a lake in St. Jame's Park as a result of a shortage of oxygen. Works ministry personnel remedied the situation by pumping jets of fresh water into the lake.

LONDON — The price of tea has started to go up by half-pence a cup in transport cafes and restaurants across Britain.

Short of devaluing the pound, no other single factor could give a clearer indication of Britain's financial plight.

The basic price of tea has remained at threepence — half-penny for more than four years. Now a cup costs fourpence, nearly five cents.

The British Tea Centre estimates Britons consume some 90,000,000,000 cups a year.

The head of Katanga province's radio station ordered that news broadcasts drop the sign-off that went:

"This is the independent state of the Kantanga, where President Tshombe and his people defend Africa against communism."

LONDON — The Queen will have a special personal flag for her visit to Sierra Leone this fall, Buckingham Palace announced recently. The flag — combining the arms of the former African colony and the letter E set against a blue background — will be flown at all ceremonies attended by the Queen.

The Bible To-day Minimum Prices For Canadian Seed

An emergency situation in Indonesia eighteen months ago called for a crash programme of printing the Scriptures. It was decided to import 500,000 copies in 22 languages. A review of this programme in the light of the increasing demand brought the decision to produce 30,000 Bibles in Javanese, 50,000 in Toba Batah as well as 50,000 New Testaments in Indonesian. Fifty thousand of the Klinskert-Bode version of the Bible will be printed in Bahasa Indonesian.

After long consultation, the Indonesian Government has decided to allow part of the War Damage Reparation Fund to be used for the printing, in Japan, of 500,000 Bibles in Indonesian.

The negotiations between the Japanese and Indonesian Governments are already in progress and it is expected that soon the Bibles will be available.

These measures will begin to meet the immediate need for Scriptures and provide supplies during the time it will take to de-

velop the plans to print the Scriptures in Indonesian.

Rye (Tetra rektus)

Winter Barley (mostly Hudson variety)

These prices are ten cents per bushel higher for winter wheat and rye than last year's, with winter barley the same.

Some rust and lodging have affected winter wheat in Ontario, and higher feed prices have resulted, mainly from drought conditions in Western Canada.

It is pointed out that rye can be used satisfactorily as sixty to seventy per cent of grain rations, provided it is combined with feed reasonably high in protein, such as good hay.

Winter barley is likely to increase in popularity as a feed crop, particularly in some sections of Southwestern Ontario. At present, production is largely confined to the malting trade.



Do YOU require a RETAIL SALES TAX VENDOR'S PERMIT?

Retailers, wholesalers, manufacturers and all others who sell goods as a normal part of their business must apply for a Retail Sales Tax Vendor's Permit.

You are required to have your Permit by September 1st, when The Ontario Retail Sales Tax Act goes into effect. If you do not have this Permit, you will be unable to buy tax-free the taxable goods you purchase for resale. Also, if you sell goods after August 31st without being registered as a vendor you will be in default under the Retail Sales Tax Act.

It is in your own best interest to fill out and return the official Application Form at once. Otherwise, you will not be sure of receiving your Permit before the final deadline of September 1st.

With your Vendor's Permit you will receive a convenient summary of The Retail Sales Tax Act as it affects your particular line of business.

APPLY NOW to be sure of receiving your Vendor's Permit before September 1st.

PERMIT APPLICATIONS ALREADY RECEIVED ARE BEING PROCESSED AND WILL BE ISSUED ON AND AFTER AUGUST 18, AND BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1.
