To be eligible for premiums, by the producer or his agent and must be slaughtered at a plant N. Cobalt Wedding where federal carcass grading is available. Payment will be on the basis of an official carcass grading certificate issued by a government grader.

It will therefore be necessary for producers to tag their lambs to preserve their identity through Krick, and information concerning use can be obtained from Mr. Cook or Mr. Krick.

Also, each shipment of lambs to a slaughtering establishment must be accompanied by a manifest containing the following information: Name and address of the producer; The number of lambs in the shipment; The eartag numbers.

Manifest books can be obtained without cost from Mr. Cook at the Farm Services building.

The premiums will be paid in much the same manner as that now used to pay premiums on quality hog carcasses. Settlement forms will show the grade of the appropriate premium. The warrant
