

Campsalls Win Opener Take Moneta at Beach

New Liskeard Campsalls won the first game in the Northern Ontario Fastball semi-finals against Moneta with a four run splurge in the fourth inning. Final score was five to two.

Gordon McKnight chalked up his eighth straight win in the playoffs with a four-hitter. He gave no walks, and fanned ten. Behind him the team booted three, one of which resulted in a run. The other run was a homer in the top of the ninth.

Liskeard batters didn't get fat off the offerings of Lefebvre and Merritt, but they made their hits count.

Moneta became a threat in the top of the ninth when Merritt reached first on an error and catcher Delmonte caught one of McKnight's slants for a home run when the fielder misjudged the fly ball. Two infield outs and a strike-out cooled the rally.

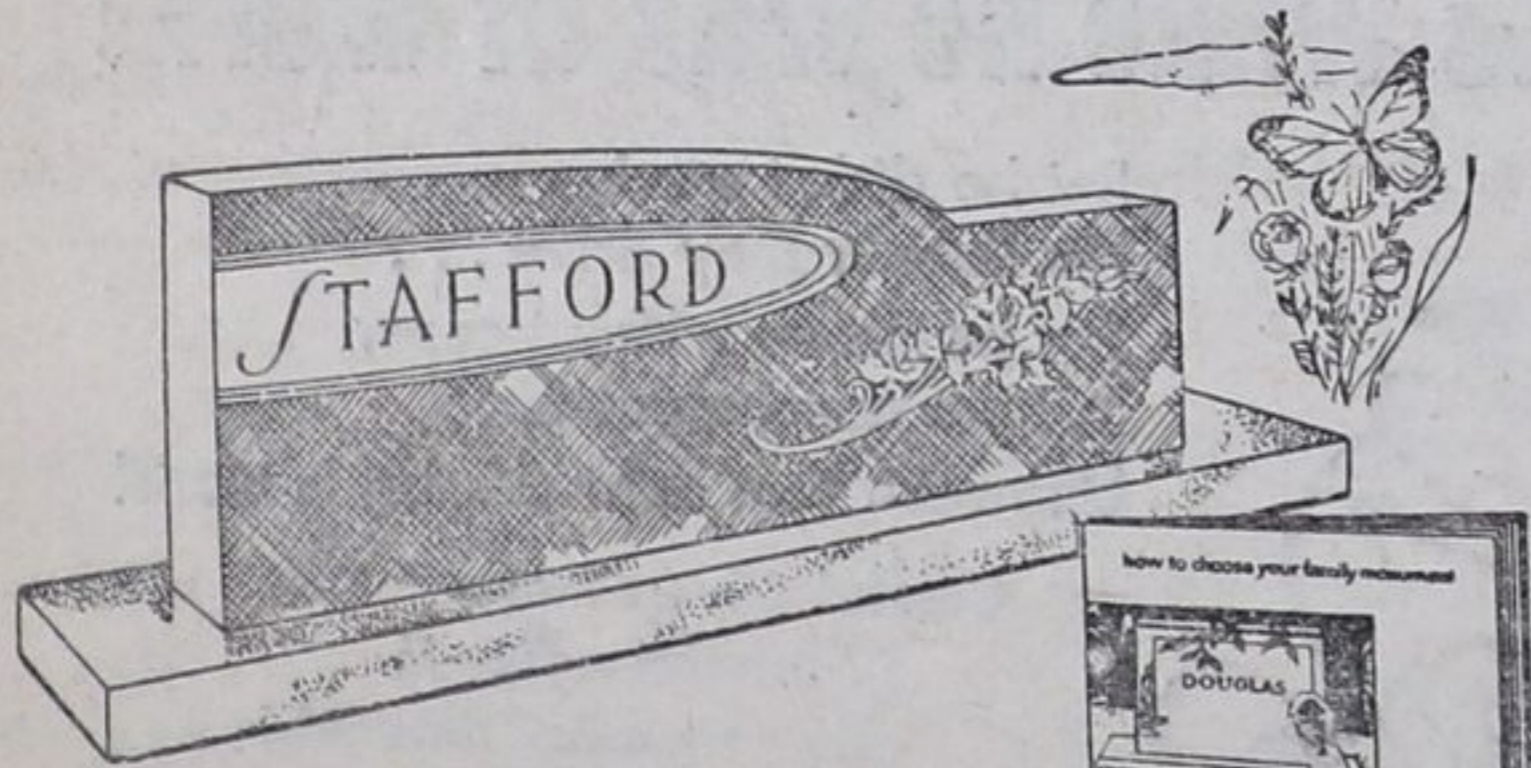
