In the course of his official duties, Mr. Spooner had this to say, "The people of Northern Ontario have many good reasons to rejoice to-day. We have reached another important stage of the improvement of our means of communications. We are officially celebrating to-day the opening of the Earlton By-pass as well as the elimination, through the construction of two new bridges, of bottlenecks which had for quite some time hampered travel along roads linking Northern Ontario with the Quebec System to the East.

Representing as I do the Ontario Government at this function, I must say that I am most happy to join my fellow north-Ontarians in this celebration. Roads, to us, are like "meat and potatoes" and lots of gravy to hungry men. We will never have enough of them. We need them to open up our undeveloped resources. We need them to attract tourists. We need them to cut the costs of transportation of our products, to cut down the price of goods that our peculiar economic fabric compels us to bring in from the south. Roads, to us, are as important as a good arterial system is to a sound heart."
