

Holy Name Irish In Double Win

New Liskeard Cubs dropped their second straight game to Holy Name Irish when they met at Kirkland Lake Arena on Tuesday. The Irish scored in all three periods and the Cubs managed a lone counter in the last 20 minutes of the game. The final score was 4-1.

The game was a fairly clean one, Liskeard had two minors and Holy Name four. The Irish scored one goal when the Cubs were short-handed and one when they were short-handed. The Cubs couldn't click on their power play at all.

Holy Name scored twice in the first period with Burak and Clark as marksmen. The second period counter was earned by speedster Fong and Cain beat Grenon for the Irish final counter. Anderson scored Liskeard's only goal.

Coach Don Shepherdson is not discouraged by the slow start of his team. "We have a lot of new men to break in," he said, "and also have to revamp all our lines. The other teams have hold-over lines from last year, with an edge on our comparatively green defence."

Gary Bonney, the little goal tender for Holy Name Irish, proved to be the downfall for the Cubs last Friday night as he registered his first shutout of the season, and the first one in the past two seasons in the league. Gary had Lady Luck with him, but he also proved he deserved the shutout as he gobbled up every puck.

Holy Name scored one marker in the first stanza, then added a pair in each of the remaining two periods. Baronoski proved to be the big gun for the winners with a hat-trick, and his linemate, Fong, blinked the red light for the other two counters.

In the first stanza Fong tallied when he pushed one by goalie Jean-Paul Grenon.

Baronoski shot the Irish into a 2-0 lead after picking up a loose puck and firing a screen shot at the helpless Grenon. Campbell's goal-mouth pass set Baronoski up for his second goal minutes later.

Less than two minutes in the final period saw Fong tick the light for his second tally as he walked in on Grenon alone. Baronoski's hat-trick was completed when he connected with Campbell's rebound and flipped it passed the agile goalie.

Referees John Dunn and "Porkey" Waters punished 13 minor infractions.
