More Than Sixty% Earn Over \$4,000

NEW YORK, Oct. 31 — According to a nationwide survey, Temiskaming District has more of its families in the "over \$4,000" income brackets and a smaller proportion of them in the lower income groups than have most places in Canada.

Locally, the trend has been toward bigger incomes in recent years, with the result that families have been moving up to higher brackets.

How they stood at the beginning of this year is revealed by Sales Management in a copyrighted report, that details, for Canada and the United States, what portion of its population falls within each of the income categories.

The report gives a clearer meaning to the term "average income" as applied to a particular com-

munity. It shows whether the average represents earnings that are well distributed or whether it represents a few families with high incomes compensating for a large number with meager earnings.

In Temiskaming District the balance is good and the average relatively high. Some 61.1 per cent of the local households now have cash incomes, after taxes, of \$4,000 or more.

That is a better situation than prevails in most parts of Canada, where only 53.4 per cent of all households are in the "over \$4,000" brackets.

Is the trend toward higher incomes in Canada purely a product of inflation or has it produced real gains for people? The economic reports show that there has been a substantial improvement in living standards for the average Canadian. He has more discretionary income left, after paying for the necessities, than ever before.

The current survey lists 13.3 per cent of Temiskaming District households in the \$7,000 to \$10,000 bracket. As a unit, they account for 21.3 per cent of all local income.

Those with cash earnings of \$2,500 to \$4,000 a year comprise 22.2 per cent of the households. They garner 14.0 per cent of the local income.

The 61.1 per cent who are in the groups with earnings above \$4,000 receive 81.1 per cent of the total income.

Funeral Services For G. Panarites

One of Cobalt's pioneer residents George J. Panarites passed away at his home on Sunday, Oct. 15. Mr. Panarites had been in poor health for the past ten years and was confined to his bed for the last four months. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Panarites and was born at Koupia, Greece, on March 17, 1877. In 1906 in Pakia, Greece, he was married to his wife Alexandra who survives him. Coming to Canada in 1907, he settled in Cobalt where he was so well known as the congenial and respected owner of the Minerva Restaurant until his retirement.

He leaves to mourn his loss his wife, one son Peter, three daughters Mrs. Cora Petrakos, Mrs. Katie Woods, Miss Stella Panarites, one brother Kosmos Panarites, Hilton, N.Y., U.S.A., on sister, Elaine Panarites of Koupia, Greece and two grandchildren James and Alexandra Woods. The body rested at his residence 14 Grandview Ave., until Tuesday, Oct. 17 when services were held at 3 p.m. at St. James Anglican Church with Rev. D. A. P. Smith officiating. Burial was in the Mount Pleasant cemetery, Haileybury. Honourary pallbearers were Mayor Purdy, Marvin Armstrong, George Orfankos and Reddy Tessolini. Active pallbearers were his son Peter Panarites, nephews Manuel, John and Peter Panites, nephew Sam Panos, and sons in law Gus Petrakos and Walter Woods.
