**Letters to The Taxpayers**

This coming Monday Dec. 4th you will have the obligation of voting for the candidates of your choice for positions with the Town Council and the Board of Education. It was my honour to have been nominated to both of these groups. I chose to stand for election to the Board of Education because a position with this group affords an opportunity to participate actively in the business of education our in the same light as a corporation young people.

I believe any School Board should consider its obligation to the public in the same light as a corporation Board of Directors considers its obligation to its shareholders. In each case a profit must be shown at the end of each year, and dividends declared as a result. In the case of the Board of Education you the taxpayers are the shareholders. The dividends shown to you at the end of each year should take the form of well educated sons and daughters. You should be given regular reports, through the press, on the proceedings of all Board meetings. Financial statements of the years operations should be included in the year end report to the public. This should be done because over half the money paid by you the taxpayer, goes toward the education of your children, and I suggest it is a moral obligation on the part of the School Board to keep the public informed, whether the public want it or not.

I also believe that if the Board is to operate efficiently, it should have clearly defined policies with regard to such things as teacher qualifications, school discipline, public information, distribution of authority and any other phrase of its operations that may lead to controversy through a lack of such mutually known and understood policies. The School Board, in my opinion, should represent the top authority in all phases of school direction that could come under Board jurisdiction.

In this regard it would be desirable to have a Board made up of people who are independant so they will be able to exercise their own good judgement with respect to School and business, without being subjected to possible outside pressure.

There appears to be little interest in our local education on the part of the public generally. This is surprising considering the importance of education, and the fact that so much of our tax money is invested in it. The School Board should promote a public awareness of the importance of their investment in every way it can, and keep on promoting it year after year. Find out all you can about your schools. Send your opinions to the Haileyburian for publication so others can know of them. Elected or not, I would like to see other letters in this paper, lots of them. Take an interest, because it is your money and your children that we are talking about.

I solicit your support on voting day.

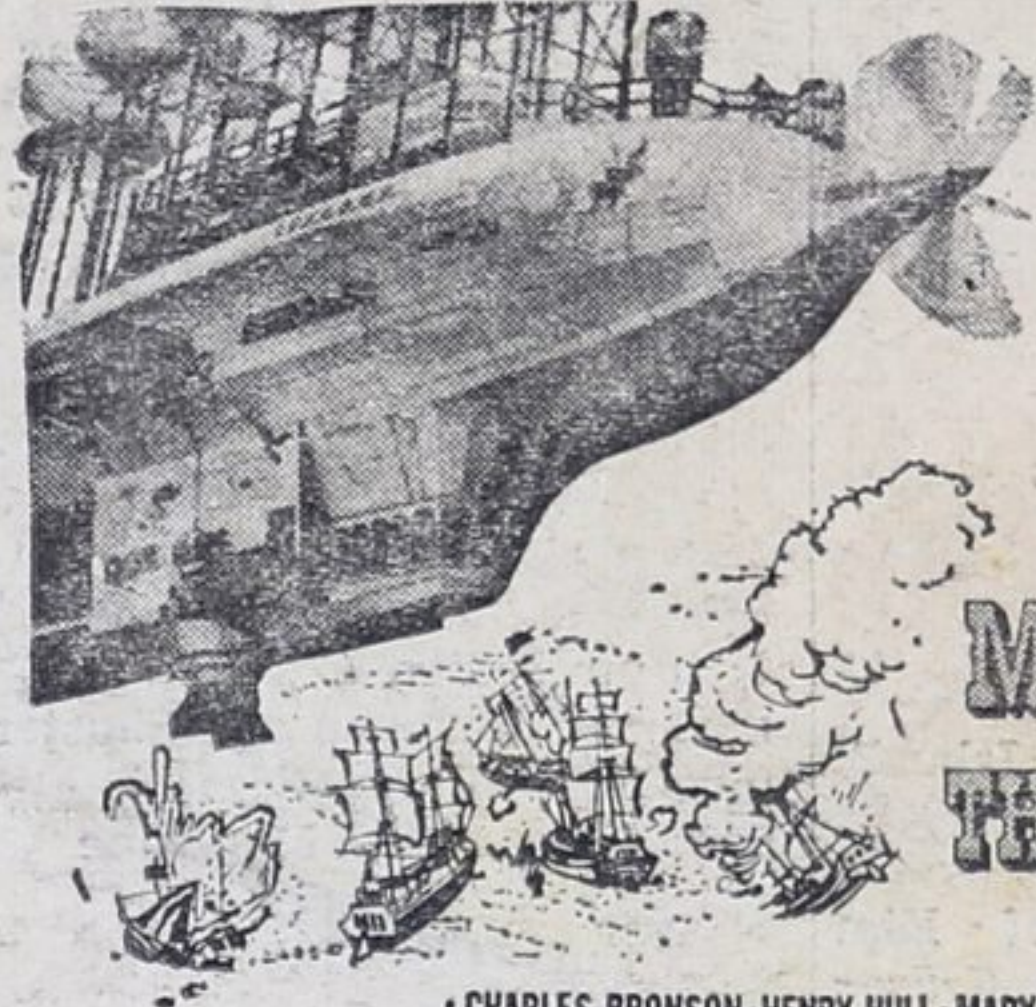

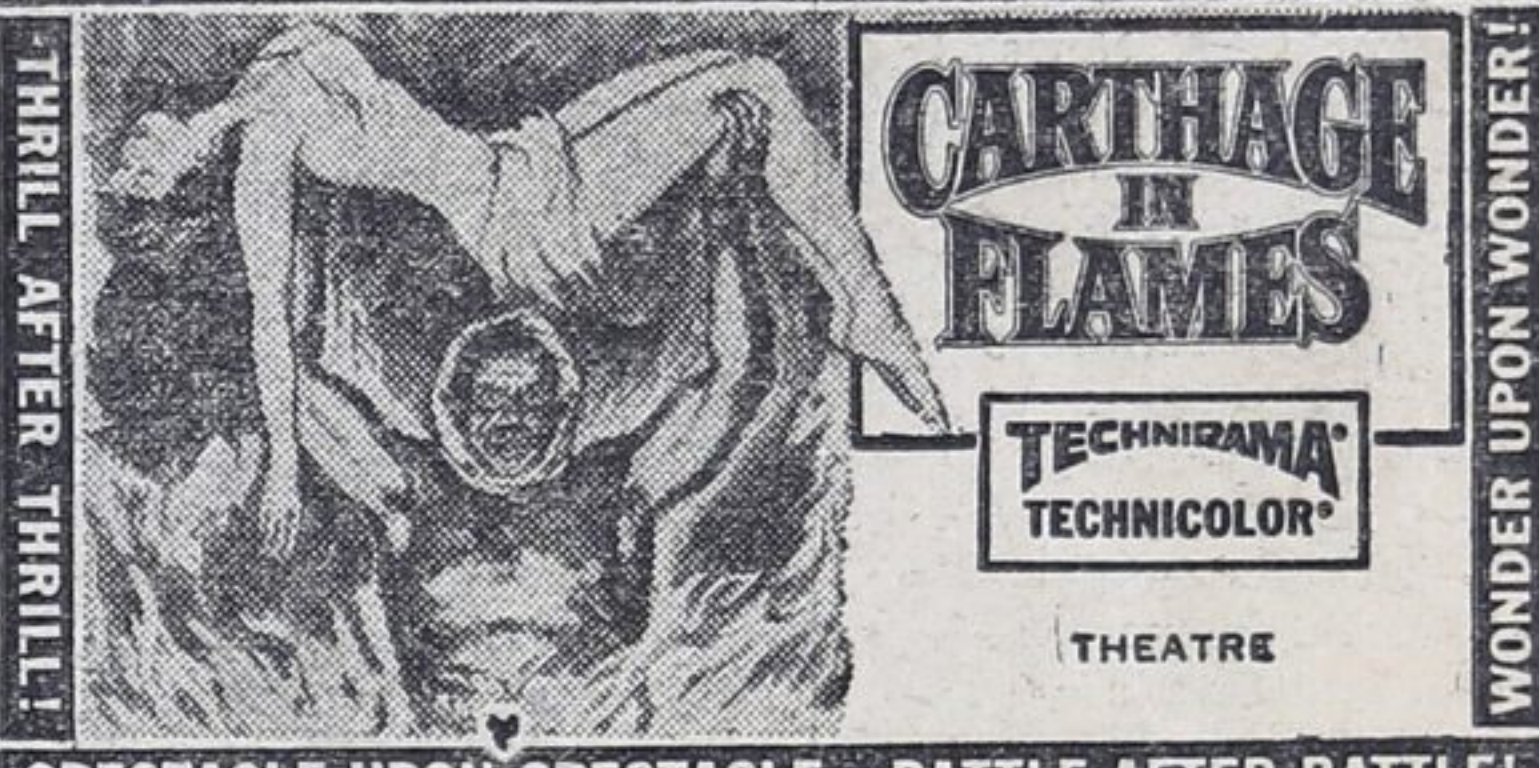
