The Financial Information Return (FIR) is Municipal Affairs' effort for consistent municipal reporting. The Database manager, Frank Guzzo, has all the checks and balances to ensure integrity and consistency in reporting before accepting the data.

Exactly the same information is reported for each municipality and the reporting methods are exactly the same, grocery store arithmetic, no mysteries.

The good Finance Director should stop shooting herself in the foot. The information is in the public domain and she should wake up to the need for professional analysis and ranking.

The tax paying entity is the residence, not the household, and the only sensible denominator. Towntrak scores 34 such performance parameters and then ranks the towns against and average and the benchmark performance for the sample. Towntrak also looks at trends over five years to anchor the analy-

Towntrak is a powerful Benchmarking service. Administrators and councillors are affronted in having their comfortable fiefdom exposed.

It must be traumatic and hazardous for lousy performers, people who come 78th out of 94. But it won't go away until something positive is done in managing this Town, instead of being managed by the Town.


