project that will replace the
existing two-lane road with a
single-span a four-lane structure.

At 7 p.m. Monday night Mardave Construction site supervisor Flemming Stipsen said crews were ready to right the toppled crane and then move it from the site.

"Drillco will remove this

crane and move a new one in to complete the job. We will lose one day's work because of this accident," Stipsen said, rejecting a request to interview the crane operator, noting "that there's a lot of money sitting there and he's trying to get this cleaned up."

Stipsen refused to speculate on how the accident occurred.

Couple faces charges

A Georgetown couple faces a variety of charges in connection with a scheme to defraud Bell Canada of about \$4 million.

Metro Toronto Police allege the couple was working with a Bell employee, processing false claims and transferring the money to a private bank account over a five year period.

The Georgetown couple is charged with fraud, laundering criminal proceeds and the acceptance of a secret commission.
