Storage space for food bank sought

A request that Acton's FoodShare be able to use 1,000 square feet of space on the lower level of the old Acton Fire Hall prompted Ward 4 Councillor Al Cook to ask that the same offer be made to organizers of the new Georgetown food bank, who have been unable to find a new location.

Town staff have been asked to report on the feasi-

bility of the Fire Hall being used by Acton FoodShare, which has lost some of its donated storage space because of the expansion of another business in the same building.

Cook said the Georgetown woman who is attempting to open a new food bank, has been unable to find affordable or donated space and, in fact, is storing food in her home.

"I think she should also be

given the opportunity to come before Council and ask for municipal storage space," Cook said.

Council did not approve the use of the old Fire Hall by Acton Food Share but instead sent the request to municipal staff to prepare a written report, which will also deal with a suggestion from Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson that the Georgetown food bank donations could be stored in Acton.

Education director steps down for health reasons

At the Board meeting of Aug. 29, the Halton Board of Education approved a request for re-assignment from Bob Williams, director for education, that he be assigned as a Superintendent as soon as a new Director of Education can be found.

A committee of trustees is to be established to hire a consultant and develop a list of candidates for consideration by the Board.

"On behalf of the Board, I want to thank Bob for his leadership and direction during the past eight years," said Linda Glover, chair of the Board.

"His vision for the future of the system and his personal, caring approach for both students and staff have won him wide respect throughout the system. I know that he will continue to carry his enthusiasm and positive approach into his new role."

"It was in my best interests and the best interests of the system that I made this request," Williams said.

"I have experienced sev-

eral stress-related 'warning signals' in the past few months and it is on the advice of my physician, wife and family that I have made this decision.

"I also believe it is time for a change in leadership.

"I have been privileged enough to serve as director for over eight years. It has been a challenging and satisfying role and I have enjoyed the support of a wonderful staff," Williams said.

Glover added her thoughts


to the departing Director.
