Play opened up in third period and the Raiders found themselves in penalty trouble.

Dan Kerluke opened the scoring for Brampton at 4:34 with the only even strength goal of the period. Georgetown was unable to capitalize on a two man advantage but Kris-Barch dented the mesh short handed to put the hosts back into the lead. Two power play goals from Brampton's Rob Rieter and Adam Deleeuwhad Georgetown behind the eight ball with four minutes remaining in regulation time.

Zander and White were both very active in youth soccer in Georgetown.


