· Dorothy Hunt receives the Ralph Ursel Award for voluntary work in the arts.




Dorothy Hunt

· Ron Hill has been selected as recipient of the Arts






Alive Award for the Performing Arts. Hill joined Georgetown Little Theatre a year after its inception in 1960. Performing in 36 GLT plays and directing 19,
