

Numbers surprise cops at meeting

Constables from Halton Regional Police were surprised by such a large turnout Sunday, at a meeting held to solve Georgetown's skateboarding problem.

Const. Keith Bennett said he was expecting about 50 people at the meeting. He estimated attendance at 180.

Several skateboarders said that what they are doing is not illegal and that the whole can't be held responsible for the actions of a few.

The point was also made that this is a growing sport and shows no indications of dying off.

"What this shows me is

that there is a commitment and that's great. The main goal of the meeting was to make both sides aware of the issue, to make people aware of the complaints that were coming in, to try and present a more positive image. I think those goals were met," Bennett said.
