

Legions host tournaments in the coming weeks

Collingwood Legion hosts a large weekend tourney commencing Oct. 18. Events planned are blind draw doubles, men's and ladies' singles and doubles, open cricket doubles and mixed doubles. Total payout is expected to be \$5,000 and some of the area's top players will be present. Entry fees for the events range from \$10 to \$20. The tourney is scheduled to start at 8 pm on the 18th.

In similar fashion, the Stoney Creek Legion, is hosting a charity shoot open on Oct. 27, for singles and doubles. Registration is from 10:30 am until play starts at noon. Entry fees are \$5 per event plus a can of non-perishable food. One dollar of the entry fee will be retained for charity and the remainder returned in prizes.

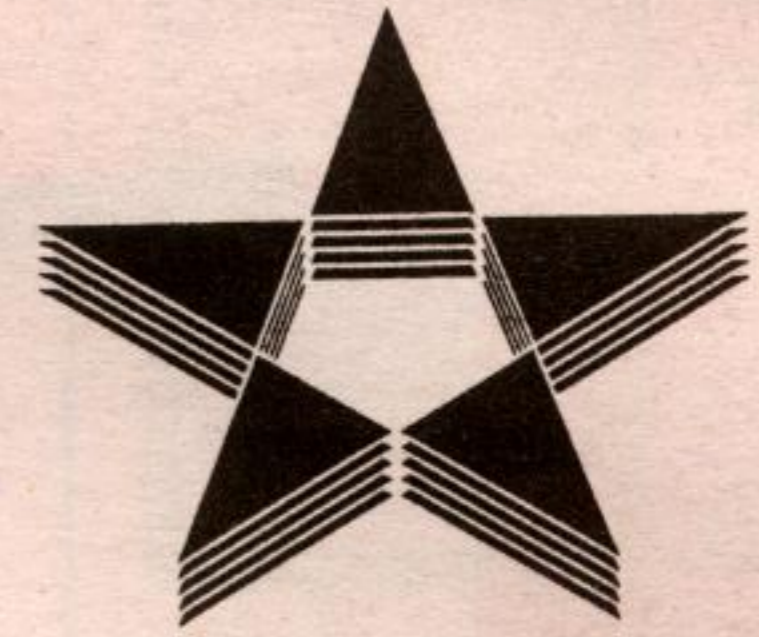

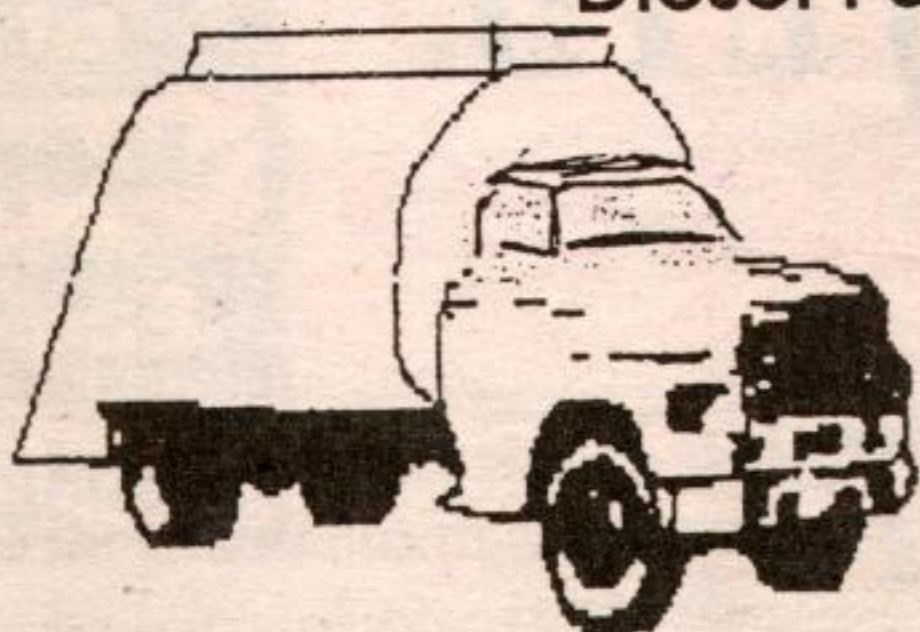

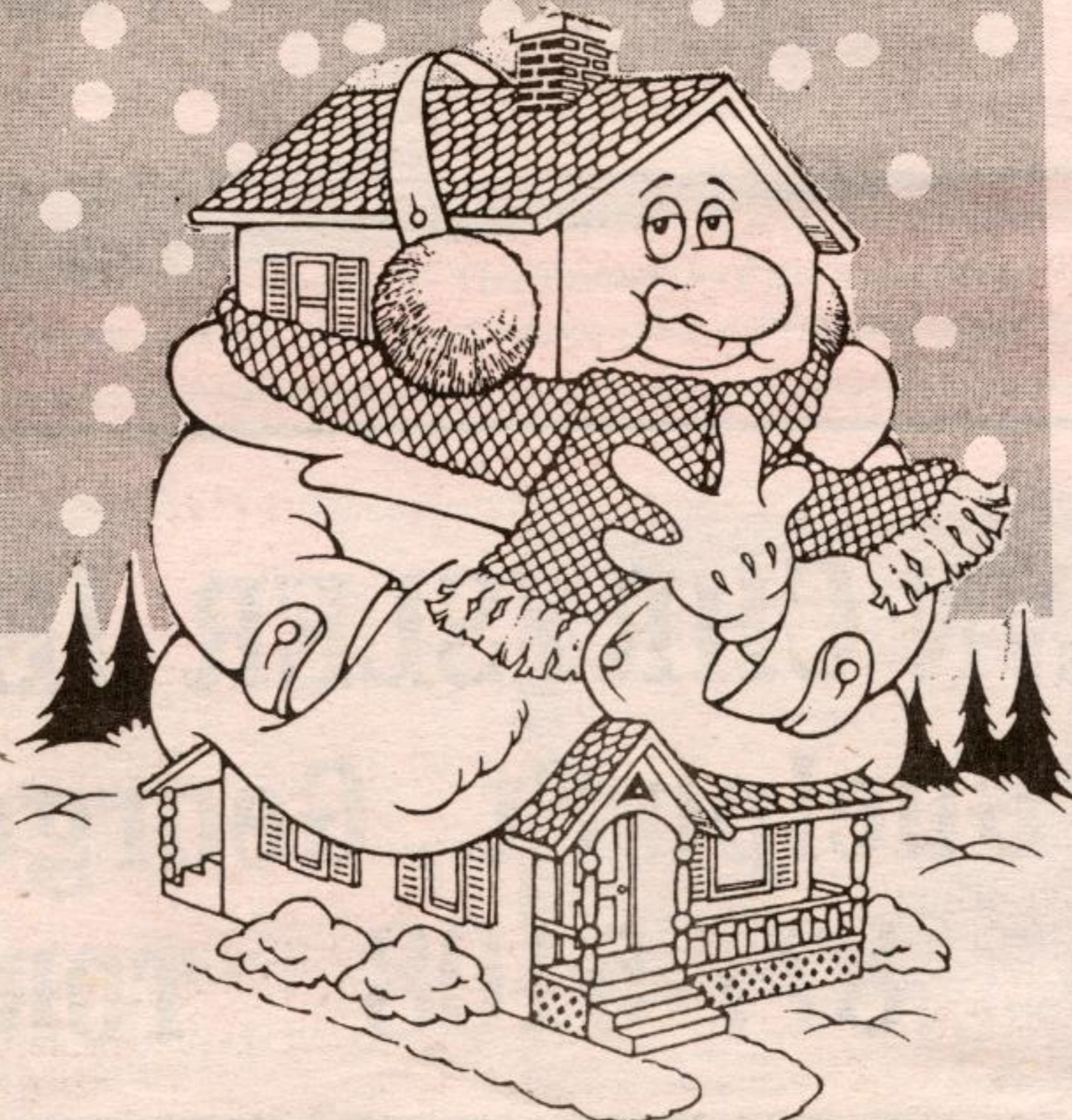
