Georgetown South cemetery studied

Developing a new cemetery adjacent to a proposed major sports park in Georgetown South is one option Town staff will study as it looks long-range at both future park and cemetery needs.

Initially staff's cemetery update was requested by Council as background for a 1999 budget item to buy more cemetery land. The issue of putting a cemetery in the proposed major sports park came up in September in a draft report by the Community Parkland Needs and Acquisition Study.

That study proposed eight scenarios for a major sports facility and at least two of them included a cemetery adjacent to the sports park.

The Town's Manager of Parks and Cemeteries, Bryan Shynal, said that his next action will be to bring to general Committee a recommen-

dation concerning site selection criteria.

"That will either be with an option for adjacent cemetery uses or without consideration for adjacent cemetery uses," Shynal said last week.

Staff will also draft terms of reference for a consultative study process to pinpoint alternatives, including the private sector, once Greenwood Cemetery is full.

Because of a relative short supply of single grave plots in both the Catholic and non-Catholic sections, staff will also prepare a redesign concept to provide additional single grave plots, cremation plots and Niche walls.

Staff reports that the re-

maining capacity to meet current demand for plot sales at Greenwood is limited to eight to 10 years at best, and if it's necessary to establish a new facility after Greenwood closes, the study process should begin now.

Although the municipality is under no obligation to provide cemetery services, the Cemeteries Act makes the host municipality assume and maintain any privately owned cemetery which becomes abandoned.

Besides Greenwood Cemetery, the Town owns and operates Acton's Fairview Cemetery, which has capacity well into the 21st century, and six pioneer cemeteries.
