Plan causes 'confusion and angst' at meeting

"I met with (Town Engineer) Peter Linn Thursday afternoon and was told one thing about parking on the east side of Main Street, yet that night what I'd been told was not reflected on the maps," Anderson said on Sunday.

"When I questioned it, I was asked what I thought about the proposed parking area that hours earlier I was told wouldn't be there. It's confusing."

The provision of additional on-street parking and a

sidewalk on the east side of Main Street continue to be contentious issues. The Town consultant's preferred alternative solution includes upgrading existing underground services, improvement to storm water drainage, replacement of existing pavement, new curbs, sidewalks, and landscaping.

Modification suggested by the local residents that were included by the consultant in the latest plan include narrowing the pavement width between Maple and Park Street, narrowing the width

of traffic lanes in the residential area through the use of surface markings and the addition of some traffic calming measures including raised median islands.

Parking in the residential area on the east side of Main Street will be provided in in-

dividual or grouped parking bays only in areas of existing demand and in the section between Park Street and Church Street.

Residents have until Friday to comment in writing on the design. Construction is slated for this summer.
