Halton new riding in election

A new federal electoral boundaries came into effect in January, making Halton a separate riding. Gone is the former federal riding of Halton-Peel.

Representation in the House of Commons is readjusted in accordance with the Constitution Act, and the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act.

The boundaries respond to population changes and were drawn in an effort to keep the population of ridings near 100,000.

Those in the existing riding of Halton will become part of a new riding of Halton.
