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**County Council.**  
MILTON, JULY 26, 1873.  
The Council met at 10 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice for special meeting issued by order of the Warden.

The Warden in the chair. Members present—Messrs. Clay, Lyon, Foster, McKenzie, McEury, Ramsey, Robinson and Young. Mr. Ramsey moved, seconded by Mr. Lyon, that the corporation of the County of Halton have always adhered, and now adhere, to the terms of the contract between the corporation and G. Blain, for the building and completion of the new Jail, and making alterations and additions to the Court House at Milton, and the corporation have always refused, and now refuse, to submit the question of what is "extra work" in the performance of the said contract, to arbitration, and the corporation has not authorized the reference of this question to arbitration, but have always been ready and willing to join in all such acts as might be necessary to obtain the decision of the architect named in the said contract, on the question of what work is "extra work," and to act upon his certificate thereof, and to refer the valuation of such extra work, or of work omitted, to arbitration, in pursuance of the terms of the contract and specifications; but the corporation have always disputed, and now dispute, any extra work claimed by the said G. Blain to be extra work, unless it is allowed and decided to be extra work by the architect, and now refuse, to submit this question to arbitration.

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
