Editorial Notes.

It is reported that the Dominion Parliament will meet on Thursday, January the 13th.

A hotel keeper was fined fifty dollars at the Brantford Police Court on Monday for selling liquor to an Indian on Saturday.

It is likely that the Biddulph prisoners will be tried by a special commission, recommended by Judge Arnone, Mr. Mowat being favorable to that course of procedure.

Tuesday there died in Toronto one of the wealthiest if not the wealthiest man in Canada—William Cawthra, aged 80 years. His wealth is estimated at from \$3,000,000 to \$7,000,000.

The Grand Trunk Railway has become so prosperous under the management of Mr. Hickson, that the board of directors has awarded the sum of \$12,500 as a gratuity and extra compensation for good management.

A correspondent writes to a Toronto paper, the subject being temperance, that what all need to be taught is "not to abuse the gifts of God." We think it is the opinion of the majority of the people that it is an abuse of God's gift of wheat to turn it into whiskey instead of bread.

More Manufactures.

The great benefits that would arise from having more large manufacturers in our midst are too well known to need enlarging or expatiating upon. Every one is sufficiently conversant with the impetus such establishments give to all branches of business, and their attraction of commerce of every kind.

Although Acton has a number of good manufacturers, still we think that our village is favorably situated for other business on a large scale. The country around is excellent, water abundant, and shipping facilities good. All that is needed is some energetic persons to take hold of the enterprise. We would invite discussion on this subject, believing that anything promoted for the benefit of the town will receive the hearty co-operation and support of the town generally.

Holding Back Grain.

It is evident that our farmers, in a good many parts of the country are holding back their grain from the market, in the hope that by so doing they will obtain more money for it later on. Canadian farmers are not singular in this respect, for we find the American papers commenting upon a similar condition of things in the Western States. The New York Bulletin, recently showed that while the total crop of wheat this year exceeds last by perhaps 40,000,000 bushels, the receipts at the seaboard and the exports abroad are less than in the like period of 1879; from which it concludes that there are 50,000,000 bushels more wheat in the Western Interior, and on the Pacific coast than at this date last year. In the meantime, we are approaching the close of navigation, after which the farmer will be for five months at the mercy of the railroads and will have to pay probably 10 to 15 cents per 100 more than the current rates of freight. It is out of the question to suppose that the course of prices this year can correspond to the steady rise after the opening of the season that occurred last year, and it is just as unreasonable to compare this season's conditions of supply and demand with those of either of the two past years. This year's United States crop is all probably exceeded that of 1878 by 55 to 70 millions of bushels, and the European crop is about an average one, while that of 1878 was a very deficient one, especially in England and France. Under these circumstances there is little chance for a rise in the price of grain.

Which Is the Selfish Party?

The Hamilton Spectator admits that E. King Dodd is paid for his advocacy of the liquor cause, and it reports that some leading temperance advocates are also paid for their work. The Spectator means thereby to infer that the supporters of both sides are actuated by equally selfish and personal motives; he will not succeed in blinding anyone to the truth. The liquor champion is paid by men whose wife chievous business it is sought to suppress, and whose motives are as utterly selfish as those of the robber who pays a lawyer, out of his takings, a fat fee for defending him in the criminal court. They are, as a matter of course, defending the business by which they make their living, but whose gains result inevitably in the poverty, crime, tears and heartbreakings of others. Those who give their money to export prohibition advocates give it with no thought of personal gain. They exert no pecuniary advantage beyond that which would accrue to all taxpayers from the suppression of the chief cause of crime and poverty with the consequent police and poor rates. Their motives are purely patriotic or philanthropic, and as disinterested, in most cases, as if they were giving to foreign missions. Liquor men never help their cause by spending about paid, temperance advocates, if they simply sell people to thinking about where the real selfishness lies.—Montreal Witness.
