By a fence being left down the cattle, seven in number, got on the track, and only two escaped the iron horse. One of the animals was carried about two miles and a half on the front of the engine, and when the train was stopped and the cow lifted off, she started up the track as if nothing had happened. The owners of the cattle were workmen at Lawrence's Mills, and their loss will amount to about \$75. As it is usual in such accidents no person was to blame.
