## NASSAGAWEYA SHOW.

The Nassagaweya Township Show, held on Friday, was the whole very successful, and somewhat improved in quality, though lacking a little in quantity of inside exhibits as compared with last year. There was a large attendance of people, who seemed to take a great interest in the show. Unfortunately, the field where the horses and cattle were shown was a pea stubble, and the crowd was continually enveloped in a cloud of dust. It is to be hoped that a sod field will be procured by another year. Most of the inside exhibits were very good, especially potatoes, which were excellent, and speak highly for the township in growing that sort of crop. The turnips were good considering the very dry season, and the grain kept up the credit of the neighbourhood in which it was raised. The fruit was rather small, and there was but a very small quantity of it. There was some very good ladies work. One centre of attraction in the inside was a drawing, representing a man with blue boots holding a red dog with a blue eye, and a few other grotesquely painted animals standing by. The outside was ahead of the inside in having a much larger supply of exhibits. The cattle, sheep and pigs were good and fully ahead of last year, but the chief attraction was the horses. There was a splendid show of the latter, and considerable interest was manifested in the buggy horses, as there was a large number of entries and most of them very good. The last exhibit however, was the most interesting, being the best single horse, buggy and harness, driven by the best lady driver. The judges took considerable time to decide, no doubt having a hard task to tell which was the prettiest driver, and kept the ladies wheeling round the ring a good deal. At last they severed up courage and awarded the prize to Mr. G. L. Watson's rig, driven by Miss Mary Watson.
