### An Age of Honophes.

There is not a word in the English language that serves as well for mak ing any company or institution or busi ness undertaking unpopular as that of monoply when appled to it. Monoplies are hated because they are concieved to Fuel, be oppressive. They build up a few at expense of the many. Our country is at present almost entirely at the mercy of monoplies. The truck lines of railways have consolidated, the two telegraph companies are one, the cotton lords are on the point of forming a pool, the cart age of the Canada Pacific Railway, bas been given to one firm for twenty years, the C. P. R. itself is not to have opposi tion for the same length of time. It is an era of monopolies. No wonder our people are alarmed at the existing con dition of affairs. .

### Evaporating Fruit.

The modern process of drying fruit quickly by means of artificial beat is a great improvement on the old slow method of exposure to the sun, air, and cooking stove. In the one item of cleanliness, the advantage is very great It must be admitted that dried apples hung on strings in farmers' kitchens for weeks and months, boated with dust and traversed by innumerable flies, are not a very inviting article of food Fruit that has been dried in the open air and to which all the particles of dut that float in the atmosphere and insects of all kinds have had free acress is not much better. The eggs of moths are tiften deposited in apples while drying und these batch out afterwards. Al these and others evils are avoided by the use of evaporators. This improved process is carried on extensively in es tablishments in the United States and they are begining to find their way into this country. Small, portable evaporulots are also in the market, suitable for those who have orchards large home. enough to yield a surplus of fruit tale. They are specially adapted for drying peaches, apples and small fruits-The fruit thus prepared is veryesalable. No family that has used it would think of returning to the use of frait prepared by the eld method. Evaporated applea when cooked can hardly be distinguish ed from the green fruit. We know whereof we affirm, baving used them with much satisfaction. They cost but little-more than green fruit by the barrel. There is no waste from rotting, paring them for cooking.


